John C. Ross Succumbs at the Age of 90

Long time valley resident John C. Ross died Sunday, January 12 in a Bakersfield Convalescent Hospital, at the age of 90.

Born in Albert Lea, Minnesota on March 22, 1878, Ross came to California in 1896 settling in Pasadena. In 1904, he joined his

brothers in the Kern River Valley to work on the construction of the Edison Borel Canal. Then the Ross Brothers engaged in the mining business and mined the area off and on during the next 50 years.

Meanwhile Ross returned to Pasadena, established a business, met and married Swedish immigrant Edith M. Carlson. During World War II, he served as a military policeman for the Pasadena Water Works, then returned to the Kern River Valley to continue mining.

In his earlier years, Ross, a self-taught musician, helped provide the music for the old-time dances in the valley, participated in Chamber of Commerce work and community projects and was especially active in youth programs.

Ross is survived by his wife Edith who is confined to a convalescent hospital in Pasadena, two daughters, Bunny Tibbetts of Lake Isabella and Dorothy Douglas of Houston, Texas, three grandchildren and several nieces and nephews.

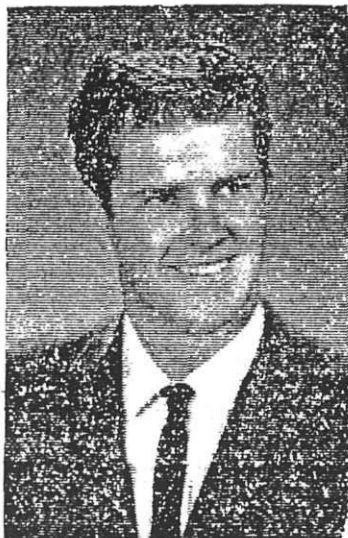
