Well known for her cooking, she was active as a member of the Cow Belles and instrumental in the compilation of the organization's cook book, Chuck's On, first published about 15 years ago. The Cow Belles, Kern County Cattlemen's Auxiliary, named her Cow Belle of the Year in 1965. Mrs. Rankin also was active in working for the Indians in the area by helping to secure their lands. She instituted a campaign to raise money to be used to repurchase land originally sold from them. The land is now governed by a board for the Indians for their use.

She also was an active member of the First Church of Christ Scientist. Wofford Heights and past president of the 7th District PTA. Mrs. Walker and her husband celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary at the Rankin Ranch in 1964. Survivors include the widower; 2 daughters, Alice Rankin Beard of El Paso, Tex. and Raechell Rankin Parker of Honolulu, Hawaii; 7 grand children, Rob Roy Rankin Beard, John Rankin Beard, Walker Rankin Beard, William Rankin Parker, Dodge Rankin Parker, Mary Lou Beard, Linda Lou Parker Meadows 4 great-grandchildren; a brother L.E. KERN VALLEY MOURNS JACK EWING'S DEATH



Memorial services will be held en Friday, January 11 at 1 p.m. in the Hollywood Chapel of the Pierce Brothers Mortuary for Jack Ewing, 20, who died on January 8 at Hollywood Presbyterian Hospital. The services will be followed by a private inurument. A beloved member of the Kern Valley, Ewing was born in Illinois on December 18, 1893 and had lived in the state for 50 years. He is survived by two daughters, Agnes Moziek and Jean Salais of Los Angeles and an adopted daughter, Buth Shaw of Wolford Heights.

Jack Ewing came to Kern County as a once-retired naval officer to initiate the construction of a huge China Lake Naval Ordinance Test Station, now the Naval Weapons Center, during the Second World War. He could have been called its first commanding officer because his special genius for getting things done cleared the way for the captains and admirals and scientists who followed in his wake.

And those same captains and admirals would be the first to grant him that distinction because they knew he had won graduation from the "can-do" school of naval chiefs who pioneered the groundwork for operations in two world wars.

He arrived in the Indian Wells Valley when it showed only remnants of a defunct desert agricultural boom created shortly after the First World War and when only two straggling wayside stations, Inyokern and Crumville, now the modern city of Ridgecrest, existed in the area.

The story of his desert naval service would rival the intrigue of any modern suspense novel. While pioneering the intial facilities of the base he was able to sidestep normal directives and procedures that would have imposed impossible barriers to flag officers firmly frozen in regulations eminating from Washington.

After serving under Captains Sherman E. Burroughs and James Sykes, first commanders of the base, he resigned from the Navy for a second time to invest in Ewings Restaurant adjacent to the station. His earlier experience as a San Diego restauranteur enabled him to create an outstanding dining establishment which helped to lift the surrounding community out of the crude, frontier atmosphere into which the war-time emergencies had literally dumped it.

This change of careers did not dampen his impelling interest in community affairs. At that time the off-station community consisted largely of disorganized trailer communities clustered at various points of access to the base. As a result hundreds of children were caught in desert sluins which erupted without planning because of the war-time urgency to lure workers to the area. To meet the recreational needs of these children, Jack Ewing organized a group which sponsored a series of rodeos to raise the funds which opened the Nine Mile Canyon Road to safe travel and established a summer camp in Kennedy Meadows for these unfortunate children.

Not long after his retirement from business in Ridgecrest and his return to San Diego he suffered a massive stroke which left him an invalid. Then he purchased the Jack Crawford home at the Fay Ranch opposite the South Fork Valley town of Weldon where he regained his mobility and most of his health.

The sight of the newly relocated town of Kernville above Lake Isabella excited his suspended drive. He suddenly announced to friends, "I've got to get active again!"

Although he always maintained that he was five years in advance of good planning, be built Ewings-on-the-Kern. At the time this came as a God-send to people of the Kern River Valley because it met a serious need for a top dining facility in the area.

Jack and his wife, Vera, developed their new business and Jack voiced the need to develop recreational facilities to augment the natural attractions of the Valley.

Thus he was impelled to organize a group to promote and build the Kern River Valley Golf Course. Later he was guest of honor when members of the golf club dedicated a bronze plaque to him as the leading spirit in bringing the project to fruition.

In the final analysis, Jack Ewing was a single-minded man who made enemies in his pursuit of political and social objectives. He also made friends; thousands of them. Those close to him were constantly amazed at the wide range of his acquaintances and of those he could call friend. He will be missed in the most remote eddies and well as the highroads of the

A Kern River Valley ploneer, Orian Franklin Campbell died December 9 following a three-year illness. He was 71 years old. Orian lived in the Kern River Valley 35 years. Over 150 friends and relatives attended his funeral services on December 11 at

the United Methodist Church in Kern-

Those attending Orian's funeral paid him tribute and remembered.

There is much about this remarkable man to recall.

Orlan Campbell arrived in the Kern River Valley in 1941. He saw a beautiful valley with a great potential for development. At that time, the Kern River Valley was a small rural community, sparsely populated and short of services.

The new arrival purchased the telephone company in old Kernville and set about the task of upgrading and expanding the primitive service. Orian later sold his first purchase to Don Golden and it was a going business.....customers doubled and telephone lines were strung from poles instead of fence posts.

Orian Campbell then began a list of "firsts" in the Kern River Valley. He built and/or developed the first laundry, trash pickup service, lumber yard, sporting goods store, appliance store, locker plant, ice cream and snack shop and was the first to irrigate farm land with a drilled well and electric pump sprinkler system.

Understandably, Orian often ran into local opposition along the way.

The community often resisted change. Orian viewed change as progress and acted accordingly.

There were three words Orian would not tolerate in his vocabulary: never, can't and impossible. During his active business years, Orlan had many occasions to ponder the lack of these three words. And so did many of his constituents.

If a development project seemed unlikely.....most likely Orian Campbell was right in the middle of it.

When old Kernville gave way to Lake Isabella, Orian turned his ambitions toward developing new Kernville. Once again he racked up a list of "firsts."

He built Ewings-on-the-Kern, Whispering Pines Lodge, McCambridge Lodge, and the first commercial building in new Kernville, which now houses a cafe and antique shop. Many other buildings in Kernville are still in use that Orian built, including the lumber yard which he operated for years.

Orian drilled many water wells in Kernville. All too many were expensive and dry.....but he kept drilling. He entered some business ventures that proved unprofitable personally

but never to a partner or investor. Orian became a one-man employment agency. Many of his myrlad business associates occasionally found themselves with a "new employee" at the behest of Orian's urgent prodding. Frequently, Orian created jobs to help a floundering man and often he was forced to borrow money from the bank to pay a man for a "created" job. Orian soon developed a widespread reputation for his ability to provide a job for anyone willing to work.

In 1957, Orian Campbell moved to the South Fork area and again became a community developer. He built the Onyx Emporium, developed the town, maintained and operated the water company and donated the ground for Scodie Park which he also helped develop. Orian maintained the Scodie Park grounds for years on a voluntary basis. He kept up the Onyx streets the same way.

The water company served the Onyx residents for a most nominal fee. Not because Orian was opposed to profit, but because he felt the area needed "greening up." The best way to "green up" is to "plant and water." He encouraged Onyx residents to "plant and water." They did and Orian's low cost water supply was most instrumental in a successful, if

During Orlan's old Kernville days, churches and preachers were difficult to finance and hard to come by. The intrepid developer had a unique system of "helping" a church fatten its coffers. Orian, on a first-name basis with everyone, developed the disconcerting, but successful, habit of surprising Saturday night revelers by dropping into bars and asking the partying ones for church donations.

Among friends, Orian was called 'the Preacher Mover." Orian cheerfully, and at no cost, moved many preachers in (and out) of the Kern

River Valley.

Three years ago, illness forced Orian Campbell to curtail and finally, to cease his seemingly never-ending activities. Fraternally, Orian was active in the Elks Club, Masonic Lodge, Eastern Star and the Weldon Methodist Church. He was also a member of the old Kernville school hoard.

Orian Campbell is survived by his wite, Gladys; daughter and son-in-law Helen and Timothy Witt, all of Onyx; one brother, Otis, Balboa Island; two grandsons, Stephen and Stuart Witt and one great-grandson.

Murray Hood Knight was born August 6, 1905 in Springtown, Texas. He left the Los Angeles ares in 1942 for old Kernville where he joined the fire department. Eventually he became captain, a rank he held until his
