# Wortley, pioneer packer, miner, author, dies at age 94

A 10-mule pack train, leaderless, ambled past the throng at the Whiskey Flat Days parade on Saturday. A woman strained her eyes to read the placard attached to a saddlebag, "In memory of Ken Wortley."

"Who is Ken Wortley?," she asked. It was a moment that drew a definable line in the crowd — between the locals and the visitors. By and large, the locals took off their cowboy hats and bowed their heads respectfully as the train passed by.

Ken Wortley, 94, died Tuesday, Feb. 9 at the Kern Valley Hospital. He was born May 23, 1898 in Paola, Kansas. A lot happened in between. Most of it happened in the Kern Vailey.

A World War I veteran, pack train operator, contractor, writer, publisher, explorer, Forest Service worker and, always, adventurer, Wortley guided Zane Grey to the famed Rainbow Bridge along the Utah-Arizona border, charted a course down the virgin waters of the Rio Balsas, was one of the first white men to set foot on Tiburon Island off Mexico's coast, and visited the distinctive wildlife of the Galapagos Islands. He also hobnobbed in the backwoods with Hollywood royalty like Cecil B. DeMille and Jessie Laskey. He built a cabin for the first true child star, Jackie Coogan, in the South Fork's Domelands Wilderness.

When Ken and his brother Chester came to the Kern Valley country after their discharge from the Marine Corps in 1919, the hackwoods was teeming with game, its streams and river were bursting with trout. Few people knew its ways, except for a handful of ranchers and

cowboys. It was a hig land, and demanded big people to reap its rewards.

In his books, "Historic Land of the Rio Bravo," "Adventures with the Mistits," and "The Story of Kernville, the Frontier Town that Refused to Die," and in the Sierra Rainhow, a monthly magazine he published from 1954 to 1964, Wortley chronicled the adventures of those big people who found a home where others found only grudging wilderness.

His tales chronicled the lives of characters such as Casey Loyd Davidson Jones, a prospector, packer, musician, moonshiner and Wortley's earliest mentor in the Kern Valley. Casey Jones despised people who lived in houses, and turned their backs on the open skies,

Bob Powers said Ken would thrill the kids with his campfire stories. He said he convinced him to put them down in writing. "That's when 'Adventures of the Misfits' began. He just talked like it just happened yesterday."

But Wortley hit pay dirt through his

brother, who was Cecil B. DeMille's first cameraman on his epic "Ten Commandments." The Wortley brothers set up a pack station, first in Sand Canyon near Inyokern, then near the Bloomfield Ranch, to pack Hollywood notables into the rugged South Fork wilderness, for fishing, hunting and exploring.

Chester, who had lung problems contracted before the war and died in 1932, told Ken about this strange young man who was desperate to meet the fabled DeMille, and idolized him, even to the point of imitating his dress and manner.

Bob Powers, a lifelong friend of the Wortleys and fellow author, said Chester arranged for the young man to meet the great man. He introduced him as a "young cartoonist," Powers said. DeMille reportedly replied, "You are a cartoon." But, as Powers said, "The more he (Cecil B. DeMille) talked to Walt Disney, the more he realized his genius."

The brothers moved their operation to Fairview in 1928 to the site of the Curtis School of Beverly Hills, where they packed the sons of Hollywood stars into the High Sierra; including Jimmy Rogers, son of Will Rogers, Noah Beery Jr., and Adolph Coors.

Ken Wortley found time to act in several Western movies filmed in Old Kernville. It was here that he met his future wife, and mother of his son, Ken Jr.

Ken Jr., former Mt. Mesa resident now living in Dana Point,

said, "He was introduced to this up-and-coming starlet. It was a true, cowboy-meets-starlet romance," he said. "I'm the issue of that marriage."

But the star-crossed romance was doomed to fail. "She didn't like the solitude of the valley. He couldn't handle life in the big city."

Ken Wortley endured many disappointments, said his son. His father ran off when he and his four siblings were young, leaving his older brother Raymond to fend for the family. Raymond, a major with the U.S. Expeditionary Force in Europe during World War I, was killed three days after the Armistice was signed in 1918. He was 23. His brother Chester also died young. His wife left him.

He kept returning to the Kern Valley, after stints in the concrete business and as a scout for mining corporations. He started working for the U.S. Forest Service, beginning at age 60, claiming they gave him the job because he was critical of their policies. He also made the occasional foray into prospecting. He staked a promising gold claim in the Coso range, but the U.S. Navy took the land for its weapons center. He and Bob Powers shared a tungsten mine near Kelso Valley up until his death.

"He probably figured the country wouldn't let him down," said Ken Jr. "The country didn't let him down."

Ken Jr. remembers when his father was nearly killed in a helicopter accident after extinguishing a small fire near his Beach Meadow station in July 1962. He was pulled from the wreckage just as it exploded. His

back and leg were broken, and he was in need of immediate medical aid. Another helicopter airlifted him into Kemville, but night closed in on the unlit airstrip. No problem. The pilot radioed ahead, and 30 or 40 of Ken's closest friends lined their cars on the landing pad with headlights blazing.

Readers of Ken Wortley's books recall that his good-natured practical jokes often landed him in jail. He was once jailed for no other reason than Clarence Pascoe, constable, needed a new floor in his jailhouse.

Ken Jr. remembers that DeMille once asked the Wortley brothers to capture a wild bear for a film he was shooting. They did so, and were transporting it to Los Angeles. Crowds formed wherever they stopped. So Ken led the bear out of the cage, charging spectators 10 cents each for a look. While at the corner of Hollywood and Vine, the bear escaped. "Dad got thrown in the pokey for his efforts."

About 10 days before his death, Ken was moved from his home in Wofford Heights to the skilled nursing center at the Kern Valley Hospital. It was not an easy choice to make for friends and family. He declined rapidly.

Ken Jr. said his father's latest book, "On the Rainbow Trail with Zane Grey (Adventures of a Packer and Guide), is being prepared for publication with the University of Arizona press.

In addition, all unsold copies of his existing books will be donated to the Kern Valley Historical Society's Museum.

Ann Prodan, a long-time friend, has arranged a memorial service

for Ken Wortley Sr. at the Veterans of Foreign Wars Hall in Lake Isabella on Saturday at 2 p.m.

Wortley was a charter member and past president of the VFW. Besides the pack train memorial and memorial service, the Whiskey Flat Rodeo was dedicated to his memory, she said.

She said that Ken was a frequent visitor to her house, where "he enjoyed sitting on the back porch, spinning yarns with all his old buddies."

She made it clear that Ken was a dedicated patriot. "He loved his country, like he loved this (Kern Valley) country."

Ken is survived by his son Ken Jr., 61; two grandsons, Cristopher, 30, of Huntington Beach, and Jeffrey, 23, of Temecula; and a great-granddaughter, Kayla, also of Temecula.

# Fighter pilot, civic leader has final respects paid

After all, the crowd of 75 was in place to celebrate the life of Bob Myrann. They knew he, as a retired fighter- and test-pilot, would have welcomed the aerial interlude.

Bob Myrann, 71, died Wednesday, Oct. 6 after a lingering illness. He was born March 22, 1922 in Tolstoy, South Dakota. In between, he kept busy.

As Tom McKinney, officiating the service, said from the biographical background given by Myrann's family, his love of flying began early, when a barnstorming pilot landed in a field near the family homestead. The plane sat idle, waiting for the pilot to return to finish repairs. The future pilot spent months in the cockpit, dreaming of airbound

At the age of 20, he found himself flying out of San Francisco, pilot of a B-17 bound for the South Pacific. He resigned his commission following the war,

after 200 missions, but reentered the service as a fighter pilot for

> craft in the Korean War. In 1954. Myrann was hired by General Dynamics as a test pilot.

the early jet

During his 20-plus years, he flew some 76 types of aircraft, ending his career as a pilot of the Air Force's F-111 in Fort Worth. Texas.

Despite the bravura required of pilots, McKinney said Myrann had a fear of the water. "He never went into the water without a lifejacket." In fact, while returning from a mission with a stalled engine, Myrann prepared to bail out. When he saw the water waiting for him below, he tried again, desperately, to restart the engine. It finally shuddered back to life.

"He never hit a parachute once, he always got the craft back home," McKinney said.

After his retirement, Myrann opened the Sportsman's Center in Lake Isabella, which quickly became the repository of tall tales and fish stories. He then became manager of the Kern Valley Shell Station and sold real estate for Century 21. His widow, Daphne,

said it took one visit, on the advice of friends, to decide the Kem Valley was the place for them. They've never looked back.

During his stay here, according to First District Supervisor Roy Ashbum, Myrann was a man who "always had a new idea, had a new project, a promotion. He succeeded at every single term."

Among his achievements was the presidency of the Lake Isabella Chamber of Commerce, as well as twice being head of the Visitors Council. He was chairman of the Kern County Parks and Recreation Commission. He initiated the Kern Valley Fish and Game Habitat Improvement Club, the Christmas Tree program and the Junior Pheasant Hunt. He was named the 1989 Lake Isabella Chamber of Commerce Man of the Year.

Myrann is survived by his wife, Daphne, son Robert and daughter Lonnie. Graveside services were held Monday in Lancaster.

His nephew, Fred Myrann, said at the service that Uncle Bob had given him his first ride in an airplane, and in a jet. During the airplane flight, he said, "We chased antelope."
