

Graves were recorded in the order in which the information was collected. There is an alphabetical listing, by surname, in the back of the book.

This work was done with as much total accuracy as is humanly possible and is a complete canvas of all visible and legible gravestones and markers found.

## THE GOLD COUNTRY ... a backward glance

The hills hold many secrets. None so well or better kept than in the Gold Country ... along the 49-er Trail. None more shrouded than the unknown and unmarked graves which prevail along this Golden Chain.

The California pioneers, the natives, the miners and their families and all who followed them represent a population who had become accustomed to hardships. Many had come across the Western wilderness; many were emigrants who had fought unbelievable odds to make it to the gold fields only to perish as their spirit and strength dissolved.

The Mother Lode chronicles are full of high-colored yarns of the coarse past; stories of the gold bandits and highwaymen and the prostitutes who followed the miners' sojourns for their "share". There were swindlers, robbers and pickpockets as thick as fleas in the Gold Rush towns. Every day there were murders, thievery and con-games. Local "law" meted out the appropriate sentences which ranged from beatings to ears being cut off, to hangings - which were frequent. These murderers, thieves and prostitutes take their places with the California natives, the emigrants and the pioneers as contributors to the history of the now-famed 49-er Trail.

When the towns were thrown up, buildings were made of freshly-cut wood, logs, brush and anything which would help accommodate the hurry. Towns sprang up overnight. Prices sprang up, too, - \$1 for a potato, \$6 for an egg. In some of these towns the population rose to 5,000 - some to 10,000. Mud often became so deep in the streets that men drowned in it. Gold flowed like water and the towns prospered. And yet, when the gold strikes played out, entire populations just deserted one town for another.

Notably, many of the old miners and their followers are still there. They

are the ones in the old graveyards along the 49-er Trail - the ones with headstones or some sort of markers. Many, however, never got to the graveyards, They are part of the best-kept secrets. And many whose remains did reach the graveyards, and whose only monuments are the trees and sky above, are also sheltered from us in secrecy. Many graves are just mounds; many just ovals of rocks. The stones on these desolate graves seem to tell us stories - tiny ovals depicting tiny babes who died within days or weeks of their birth and most in the ravaging winters. Ovals of rocks are frequently found. Perhaps these were hastily created out of a sense of urgency - for whatever reason, we can only guess.

Pause a few moments, envision this historical time and recognize an obvious truth - that these graves along the 49-er Trail near all the old towns do indeed hold stories of the painful work, the disappointments and the misfortunes of the pioneers who nursued a better life over the grizzly mountains. Then recognize the need to respect their memory.

Today, the old-timers say there is still plenty of gold concealed in the earth. Is it possible the mines will one day vibrate again as they did in the 1850s when men were men and women stirred the porridge?

## GREENWOOD

John Greenwood, a trapper and guide who came to California in 1844, established here a trading post in 1849. The mining town of Greenwood, which developed during the Gold Rush, boasted a theatre, four hotels, fourteen stores, a brewery and four saloons. Among its illustrious citizens was John A. Stone, California song writer, who was buried here in 1863.

Only a few feet inside El Dorado County from the Sacramento County line is located the Mormon Island Cemetery a few miles outside Folsom on Green Valley Road. The cemetery is off the road in a flat area that is fenced and locked.

On Green Valley Road there is a historical marker that reads:

MORMON ISLAND, NEGRO HILL, SALMON FALLS, and CONDEMNED BAR. These historic mining towns, and other mining camps of the gold rush era, now inundated by Folsom Lake are commemorated by the Mormon Island Memorial Cemetery, near by. Here were reburied the pioneers whose graves were flooded when the lake was formed by Folsom Dam. Their memory is a reminder that what we are today we owe to those who came before us.....

## SPANISH DRY DIGGINS

Spanish Dry Diggins was located about four miles north of Greenwood on the Spanish Dry Diggins Road. Spanish Bar, El Dorado Slide, Dutch Bar, Rucky Chucky, Canyon Creek and other noted localities of early mining days are located within a short distance.

The first mining claim was in 1848 by a party of Spaniards under leadership of General Andres Pico. Yields of pay dirt were very rich and the camp was soon surrounded by others along the Middle Fork of the American River. Nothing remains except traces of old mines among the hills.

RUST

William Wallace Rust is a son of William & Hannah (Haskell) Rust. He was born in the town of Ipswich, Massachusetts on 27 Apr 1827. He remained on the farm until he was about 15 when he went away to learn the blacksmith trade. He continued to work at this until 23 Sep 1849, then sailed on the Daniel Webster around Cape Horn to California arriving in San Francisco in May 1850. After a short time spent working in San Francisco, he went to the mines of Salmon Falls in El Dorado County. After about 15 months he went to Oregon Bar on the North Fork of the American River, then to El Dorado Canyon and after a few months spent in travelling for prospects, he purchased a blacksmith shop at Oregon Bar.

In 1853 William opened a bowling alley and saloon at Diamon Springs. He later went back to Salmon Falls. In 1864 he purchased the "Pleasant Grove" which was the Rust home place. He married Louisa J. Pitts on May 12, 1856. There were 13 children - Harriet M., Mareno E., Wallace, Thomas, Julia A., William, Louisa J., ALice C., Franklin, ALbert, Charles, John, and Ethel M.

JACOB ZENTGRAF FAMILY

Jacob Zentgraf was born in Saxe-Weimar-Eisnach, Germany on 12 August 1821 and who was the son of George and Mary Zentgraf, who were natives of the same place. When 16 years old he learned the stone cutters trade from his father, also a stone cutter, and continued to work at the trade in Germany, until 1852, during that year he emigrated to the United States and followed the trade at Butler, Pennsylvania, for a few months.

In 1853 he came to California via Nicaragua route, landed at San Francisco on the 11th December the same year, and began mining on Weber Creek, El Dorado, Co. In the fall of 1854 in the company of his brother Antone, they bought a place where he and Anton lived and began setting out vines that same year. Thirty-two vines had been planted on the place in 1849 by a Mr. Stevens.

This was perhaps the first vineyard in the County and all the others of early days were furnished from it. The homeplace was located on the Coloma Road about 10 miles from Folsom.

Jacob married in 1858, the month of August, to Maria Fischer who was also born in Germany. They had nine children, seven sons and two daughters. They were: George, John, Gabriel, William, Lambert, Frank, Jacob, Johanna and Mary.

There are several of the Zentgraf children buried in the cemetery, but not all have head stones or markers. Jacob Sr. and wife Maria are buried here with their children in this peaceful cemetery where the birds softly sing and the wind blows its sweet song over those who rest in solitude.
