REEDLEY — Funeral services will be announced by the Cairns Chapel for C. F. Mueller, 89, longtime Fresno County YMCA secretary and the man for whom Reedley's Mueller Park is named. He died yesterday.

Mueller was born in Germany and came to Kansas in 1894. He received his education there and met his wife, Luella while attending colloss in the field of education. They came to needley in 1909 after he served three years as principal of a Kansas high school and he became a partner with D. H. Kirsch in a business, The Fair.

Later he sold that firm and purchased a dry goods and shoe store from D. C. Krehbiel. He became executive secretary of the Fresno County YMCA in 1919 after serving on the board of directors of the group which purchased Sequoia Lake from George Hume for use as a summer camp. The location now is Camp Gaines.

He held the county YMCA post until Oct. 1, 1953, when


he retired. He was a member of the Reedley High School Board of Trustees for eight years and was a member of the First Mennonite Church. In addition to the Reedley park, a tree near Lake Sequoia and the hospital at Camp Gaines bear his name.



He leaves a sister, Mrs. Marie Bergthold of Reedley.



15 Checks Are Tied To Mrs. Dermer

Fifteen checks which a State Criminal Identification and Investigation Division documents examiner said were made out in Mrs. Doris Dermer's handwriting are in evidence in a preliminary hearing into grand theft charges involving La Tienda Guild funds.

The hearing, which opened yesterday, will continue Feb. 28. The delay was requested by Assistant Public Defender Hugh Wesley Goodwin so Mrs. Dermer's husband, Albert, can testify.

Repeat Expected

Goodwin is expected to have Dermer repeat his earlier assertion that he forced, his wife to write some of the checks and that she received; none of the proceeds.

Dermer who faces one to



guilty plea in the case, is expected to be returned from the Vacaville State Prison Reception Center to testify.

The Dermers were arrested in December when an investigation revealed the disappearance of approximately \$42,500 in guild funds raised through its thrift shop for the benefit of the Valley Children's Hospital.

Goodwin yesterday accepted as evidence a documents by Deputy Dist. Atty. Phillip Officer. The report said the checks were made out in Mrs. Dermer's handwriting.

General Authority

Mrs. J. F. Lofton, guild president, testified Mrs. Dermer had a general authority to write checks for the guild. Mrs. Dermer served as bookkeeper for the guild for 18 years.

The charges against Mrs. Dermer involve two checks written and cashed in 1969, five in 1970 and eight in 1971.
