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Iaqua Cemetery

It was a foggy day in Eureka, but I had dressed in layers of clothing because I knew that as we climbed the twisting road to Iaqua we would soon be above the fog belt and in the cloudless sky and warmth of the Kneeland hills. What a contrast; from thick stands of redwoods carpeted with ferns to golden, rolling hills of grass dotted with oak trees.

I had been on this road many times as a kid in the back of my parent's yellow '62 Chevy station wagon where the back seat faced the rear of the car. No wonder I don't get seasick and love roller coaster rides—those trips could have trained astronauts! But we always endured those dusty rides; for any visit to my parent's friends, Erwin and June Fredrickson, was an adventure! Cows to herd, grasshoppers to catch, kittens to play with, plums to pick... This trip, however, was a very different outing, for I was with Doris Mullen, a long time resident of Iaqua and our mutual friend, Janice Bertolini, and I was finally learning the names and history of the scenic points along the road. That round moss covered pool—the halfway point before we crested the ridge—was Whiskey Spring, where drivers would stop their horses to let them rest and get water, and slip in a little nip of whiskey for themselves. The creek bed that I always loved after the spring rains for its little waterfall and the rock above it that looks like the head of a man—was named Booth's Run, after a soldier who had followed it down to Elk River on his escape from Indians during the Indian "Wars" of the 1860s.

And to finally realize that the road that I always thought ended somewhere past the Fredrickson's ranch actually continued all the way to Bridgeville, Blocksburg, Alder Point and Garberville. That at one time stagecoaches and teamsters followed these ridges to avoid the dense redwood forest and crossing and re-crossing the Eel, Van Duzen and other rivers en route to Eureka. In fact, during the '64 flood this road was the only road that remained open; with help from the various ranchers that lived along the road, who relayed bands of intrepid travelers from ranch to ranch; often lending gasoline and providing food and hot coffee along the way.

Our destination this day was the Iaqua Cemetery; the final resting place for many of Iaqua's pioneers. But, first we made a stop at Duane Fredrickson's ranch home to photograph the portrait of his great-grandparents; pioneers, James P. and Amelia Fredrickson. James and Amelia homesteaded their land in October of 1870 after spending three years in the Eureka area. James, a native of Denmark, had come to the states during the gold rush, but not making his fortune, he sailed to Australia to try his luck there, where he met and married Amelia Negus. Not making his fortune in Australia either, he returned to San Francisco, and then went on to Eureka and finally settled at Iaqua.¹ There the couple had five children; Thorwald, William H., Victoria, Mary and Henrietta, some of whom are buried at the cemetery. Their son, Thorwald, married Irene Irwin, and they and most of their children are also buried at Iaqua.

Duane, the grandson of Thorwald and son of Erwin and June Fredrickson, has restored the old homestead, and his wife, Karen, has created a haven for bees in the colorful and lovely garden. The

home was originally built around 1865. A fire burned the back part of the home which was rebuilt in 1898 and an additional kitchen and pantry area was completed in 1903.

After our visit, we retraced our way back to the laqua cemetery which was originally part of the Frame ranch and where Amos Frame and his daughter, Loleta, are buried. The Frames donated the first section of land where such Pioneer families as Fredrickson, Mullen, Gift and Shaw, to name a few, are buried.

The Frame ranch was later bought by Luther Sibley in 1907; who hoped the mountain air would improve his wife's health. His wife, Florence, however, died in 1910 and is buried at the cemetery. Luther Sibley donated a 30 foot portion of the ranch to the cemetery and finally their only son, Willard Sibley, donated another 3 acre portion. Luther, Florence, Willard, and several others of their family are buried there.

Tucked away under a shade tree in the cemetery is the grave of Isaac Gift, who died 20 May, 1881; one of the earliest burials at laqua Cemetery. Isaac and his family had arrived in Humboldt County in 1865 on the steamer *Del Norte*. They spent three years living in Eureka and finally settled in the laqua area in 1868, where he engaged in stock raising.² Isaac, his wife, Eveline, and four sons, Albert, Allen, Julius and John Henry and grandson, George and his wife, Ruth Gift McBride are all buried at laqua.

We located the grave of Jennie (Furman) Mullen, the mother of Doris's late husband, Jerry. Doris had told me about Jennie on the journey to laqua. Jennie Furman, who was a native of Nashville, Tennessee, was 30 when she married 50 year-old William H. Mullen whom she had met through the Rebekah Lodge. William lived in a cabin on laqua, on the property he had homesteaded in 1869. While he built their new home, he bought Jennie a car to drive up to Kneeland. (It was noted in her obituary that she was one of the first two women drivers in Humboldt County³). But—as soon as the home was completed, the wheels were removed from the vehicle and the car stored in the barn on blocks; William deeming it too dangerous for Jennie to be driving on the winding road. This did not go over well with this fiercely independent woman. At laqua, their two sons, Jeremiah and William Furman and daughter, Frances Elizabeth (who married Cornell Paddock) were born and are also buried with some of their spouses at the laqua cemetery.

Another early homesteader of laqua was Thomas J. Shaw, who came to Humboldt County in 1867, where he lived at Bucksport. In that same year he also erected a small cabin at laqua. Over time he added to his lands and in 1871, he married Mary Ann McCord, whose parents had immigrated to the United States from Ireland. In 1884 he replaced the cabin with a modern house.⁴ In a brief conversation with Shaw descendant, Eleanor Edsall, she noted that when these pioneers replaced their cabins, the new homes were always two-stories and white; a symbol of their rising status. Thomas, Mary Ann and several of the Shaw children and spouses are buried at laqua cemetery.

Andrew John (the anglicized version of Anders Johan) Bjorkstrand, a native of Sweden, settled in the Kneeland area about 1900 after being a ship's carpenter for the Bendixon company. He and two of his following generations are also buried at laqua.

There are two graves in the cemetery; those of Mrs. Long and Mrs. Sheppard, that are marked with a simple upright slab of stone and stainless steel plaques bearing their surnames. No one really is quite sure who Mrs. Long was, but there is a story that Mrs. Sheppard was the grandmother of General James Harold "Jimmy" Doolittle, the famous aviator. Searching the internet, I found that Jimmy Doolittle's parents were Frank Henry Doolittle and Rosa C. (Cerenah) Shepard. Further investigation provided the names, Charles A. and Adelia (Fox) Sheppard, as Rosa's parents and that "Delia" was a native of County Cork, Ireland. Delia must have died at laqua; most likely just after the birth of her ninth child in January, 1882. Ben Shepherd of McKinleyville, who can claim Charles as his great-grandfather and who has Shepard bible records, states that the birth of Delia's ninth son, David, is recorded by Adelia's handwriting. Charles remarried on 20 July 1885 to Mary Emma Brown and fathered another eight children! His second wife had three children by her first marriage to a Mr. Samuels, so that was rather a large family! (Adelia is the only one of the family to be buried at laqua.) The spelling of the surname varied; daughter, Rosa, spelled it Shepard, but the majority of the family spelled it Shepherd. The second laqua school was located on property that was once part of the Shepherd ranch that is now owned by the Fredricksons (the first being located across the road from the Thomas Shaw home).

There are two other graves at laqua that little is known about; that of P. Ryan and the "Robinson Girl." Some ranch workers that had no other family are buried at laqua so perhaps these unmarked graves are also of that nature. Marsha Daly whose great grandparents, Charles and Elizabeth Marsh owned Green Point ranch in Butler Valley another remote district like Kneeland; related a story to me of a Mr. Lanahan who died at Green Point, which was also a hotel and stage coach stop, during a very snowy winter. No one was able to travel down the snow covered roads with his body, so Mr. Lanahan was buried there at the ranch.

Early graves of people who lived briefly at laqua (in comparison to the pioneers) were: William and Mary Curry, William being a veteran of the Civil War; James and Cornelia Harrison of Iowa and their son Carl and Smith and Adell Sargent.

The causes of death at laqua reflect the tragedies of life: Alexander Phillips, who drowned at Yager Creek at age 15; several people who died in car accidents and children who died in infancy as well as mothers who died in childbirth.

Among the more recent graves at the cemetery are those of Rachael Williams, a postmistress of the Kneeland Post office for 26 years. She and her husband and several relatives are buried in the cemetery. Also, Wayne Schmalz, teacher and principal of the Kneeland School for 24 years. Not necessarily members of the pioneer families, but still people who has strong ties to the laqua and Kneeland area.

laqua cemetery is a small cemetery (currently 121 burials) but one that is rich in history. It has been a pleasure and a privilege to research its history.

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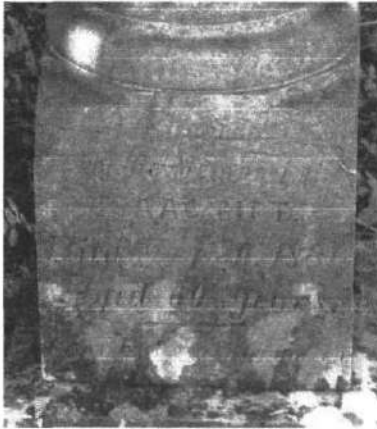
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Iaqua Cemetery

Section A



A1—Isaac Gift—was born about 1821 in Union (now Franklin), Synder Co., Pennsylvania to John Jacob Gift and Elizabeth Royer. He married Eveline Overmyer, who was born in Ohio, a daughter of Solomon Overmyer, on 30 October, 1845 in Green County, Wisconsin. Their children were: Albert, Allen Jacob, Julius F., born in Wisconsin, and Robert F., John Henry, Sarah L. and George Lincoln, born in Iowa.

According to "History of Humboldt County"⁵:

"Isaac Gift removed from Ohio to Adair county, Iowa, where he became possessor of a beautiful farm on Nodaway bottoms. On May 12, 1864, with his family he started for the



west, crossing the plains with ox teams and wagons. Two hundred miles west of the Missouri river, which crossing the Platte river, the party got a wetting, and the Gifts and some other members stopped to dry their clothes. Still others of the party, however, went on without stopping. When the Gifts and Overmiers arrived near Fort Laramie they were told of the massacre of their late companions and were shown forty new graves. The Gift teams arrived in Fort Laramie July 4 and then pressed on toward Green river. There they were surrounded by Indians and all of the little train would no doubt have been massacred but for the wisdom of Grandfather Overmier, who had had experience and understood the Indian nature. He had a long stemmed pipe with a big bowl which he smoked from behind the wagon wheels, blowing smoke to the four winds. The Indian chief, after much hesitation, finally came down, threw away his arrows and implements of war and took a whiff of the Quaker's pipe, then gave a loud whoop and all of the bucks mounted their ponies, swam the Green river and left the train in peace. The party continued on to Salt Lake City, where they traded their oxen for a span of mules and started for California. They did not succeed in crossing the desert before one of the mules laid down and died. Isaac Gift was a large, strong man, one who would not give up, so he arranged a rope and pulled against the remaining mule, carrying the neckyoke for forty-eight hours, while the boys and others rolled on the wheels until their shoulders bled, the drops falling on their bare feet; their shoes had given out and they could not replace them. To add to their suffering, they ran out of water and their tongues became parched; finally the remaining mule gave out. In the midst of their distress a man rode up from behind and kindly loaned them his mule, and with the fresh animal they arrived at Sand Springs, Nev. with tongues parched and protruding. Fortunately there were soldiers stationed at the place who kept them from drinking water and also eating to excess, so all the members of the party were saved. They then made their way to Virginia City, Nev., where Isaac Gift, being a millwright and carpenter by trade found employment in the Gold Curry mill at \$10 per day. The family remained in that city until the fall of 1864, when they came with a freighting outfit (sixteen-mule team with three big wagons, i.e. (the two trailing the first one) through the Sierras, by way of Hangtown, or Placerville to

Sacramento, where they boarded the boat Chrisopolis for San Francisco, and then on the steamer Del Norte, arriving October 12, 1865. The first three years the family spent in Eureka, until in 1868 they moved to laqua, where the elder Gift homesteaded one hundred and sixty acres near a large, cool spring. After building his house he followed stock raising until he died in 1881. His wife continued to reside on the place until her death in 1903. Their family consisted of seven children, and of them we mention the following: Albert died in Eureka in 1914; Allen lived in Eureka; Joseph in laqua; Robert in Hoquiam, Wash.; John H. is the subject of this sketch; Sarah L., Mrs. Russell died in Hydesville; George L. is also a resident of laqua."



A2-Eveline (Overmyer) Gift—born 19 March, 1826 in Ohio to Solomon Overmyer and Sallie. She was married to Isaac Gift on 30 October, 1845 in Green County, Wisconsin. She died 26 March, 1902. (Refer to her husband's, Isaac Gift, listing for more information).

This death notice appeared in the *Daily Standard* of 27 March, 1902:

"GIFT—At laqua, March 26, 1902, Eveline Gift, beloved mother of Albert, Allen J., Julius S.(sic), Robert F., John H., George I., and Sarah I., Gift, a native of Ohio, aged 76 years and 7 days.

The funeral will take place ... from the family residence, laqua. Interment at laqua cemetery."



A3-Albert Gift—was born October of 1847 in Wisconsin to Isaac and Eveline (Overmyer) Gift. Albert married Nettie Wallace in 25 January, 1880 in Eureka, California. He died 19 December, 1914 in Eureka. He had been living with his daughter Mrs. Della Knauss in Red Bluff, California where he had been working at Hobart Mills. His wife Nettie was born about 1857 and died about 1888.

A brief article regarding his death was in the 20 September, 1914 issue of the *Humboldt Times*:

"Albert Gift Dies In Eureka

Albert Gift, age 67, of Red Bluff died in Eureka yesterday after a long illness. Deceased was a native of Maine [Wisconsin], but had resided in California for 46 years. He leaves five brothers—Allen, Joseph, George and John of laqua and Robert of Grey's Harbor. The body is being held at Pierce's undertaking parlors pending arrangement for the funeral."





A4-Allen Jacob Gift—was born in about 1853 in Wisconsin to Isaac and Eveline (Overmyer) Gift. He lived with his brother, John H. Gift, at his home at laqua. He died 15 January, 1919 of rheumatism.

A short article appeared in the *Humboldt Times* of 16 January, 1919:

"Pioneer Gift Crossed Divide

Death claimed Allen Jacob Gift at a local hospital yesterday morning. He was a native of Wisconsin, 66 years of age and had been a sufferer of rheumatism for some time. For many years he had been engaged in ranching near laqua and he leaves two brothers George and Joseph (sic) Gift of that place."



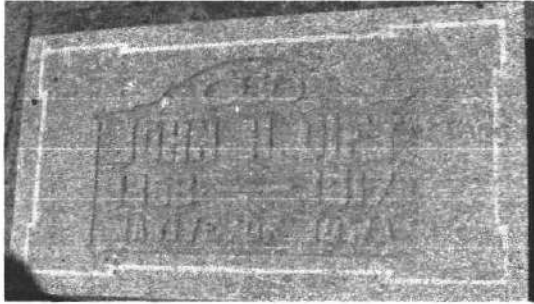
A5-Julius F. Gift—was born 12 April, 1852 in Wisconsin to Isaac and Eveline (Overmyer) Gift. He worked at the lumber mills in Eureka and on the Gift ranch on laqua where he died on 5 February, 1920 of heart disease. He was single.

A short article on his death was in the *Humboldt Times* of 7 February, 1920:

"laqua Rancher Found Dead In Ranch House

Joseph [Julius] Gift pioneer rancher of laqua died Thursday night at his ranch home. He was found on his ranch in a dying condition according to advises (sic) reaching this city and taken to the ranch house. A doctor was summoned but he was beyond aid of medical skill. The deceased was aged 69 years and a native of Wisconsin. He had been a resident of laqua for 59 years. Two brothers Robert Gift of Grays Harbor, Wash. and George L. Gift of laqua survive. The funeral will be held at laqua Saturday afternoon, the Rev. W.D. Ogg of Eureka officiating."





A6-John Henry Gift—was born 24 March, 1858 in Fontanelle, Adair County, Iowa to Isaac and Eveline (Overmyer) Gift. He married Anna Cynthia Jewett on 25 November, 1900 in Eureka, California. Their children were George Fremont, Harry Edison, Leland Wesley (who was born 4 March 1905 and died 22 March, 1905 and buried at Myrtle Grove Cemetery in Eureka) and Lloyd Martin. John H. died 16 December, 1917 in Eureka of a brain tumor. His wife, Anna C. Jewett, was born 6

September, 1869 to Norman and Annie Currie Jewett and died 15 June, 1955. She is buried at Ocean View Cemetery in Eureka.

According to the "History of Humboldt County":

"John H. Gift was a boy of five years when he crossed the plains with his parents, and on account of the harrowing Indian escapades and their narrow escape on the desert the trip was indelibly impressed on his memory. The members of the party walked nearly two thousand miles, most of it barefooted, and the lasting impressions will never be erased from Mr. Gift's memory. Since 1865 he has made his home in Humboldt county. He went to public school in Virginia City, Nev., Eureka and the laqua district. When twelve years old he began riding the range and driving cattle, also followed packing, cooking and teaming not only here, but in the Sacramento valley. He homesteaded eighty acres of land near laqua and began stock raising and improving the place, meantime making trips to the Sacramento valley, where he worked at teaming to earn money to improve his ranch. His stock increased and he did well and was thus enabled to buy land adjoining. For some years he was in partnership with his brother George, but a few years ago they divided their holdings and dissolved partnership. He now owns eleven hundred sixty acres of land. The John H. Gift ranch is well watered by streams and numerous springs and is well wooded, having quite a large tract of redwood and also other varieties, such as pine, oak and madrone. The place is devoted to cattle growing and he has about one hundred eighty head of the Short Horn Durham breed. Of late he also specialized in dairying, milking about twenty-eight cows in the season and manufacturing butter for the Eureka and San Francisco markets. He also raises large quantities of hay and grain, having threshed as much as four thousand bushels of oats a year.

The marriage of Mr. Gift occurred in Eureka where he was united with, Miss Anna C. Jewett, a native of Frederickton, New Brunswick, and they have three children, George, Harry and Lloyd. Mrs. Gift was an educator and is a woman of much ability and for ten years taught school in Humboldt county. She is now serving as trustee of laqua school district, a position her husband also held for many years, he being the clerk of the board for a time. Fraternally he is a member of the Fortuna Lodge No. 221 I.O.O.F., in Eureka and the Mount Zion Encampment, I.O.O.F. Politically he is a Republican. He served acceptably as road overseer for fifty-four miles of roads and trails in his district for five years."

This short article appeared in the *Humboldt Times* of 17 December, 1917:

"laqua Funeral of John Gift Today

The funeral of John H. Gift who died in this city Sunday morning will be held ... at the family home at laqua, interment in the laqua cemetery.

John Gift at the time of his passing was 59 years of age and for many years a resident of laqua section. He leaves to mourn his passing; a wife, Anna C. Gift and sons George and Harry Gift."





A6A-Lloyd Martin Gift—was born 28 April, 1931 in Klamath Falls, Oregon to Lloyd and Bobbiette Gift and died 26 June, 2007.

His obituary in the *Eureka Times Standard* of June 29, 2007 states:

“Lloyd “Martin” Gift, 76, peacefully passed away June 26, 2007, at home, on the family ranch near Kneeland, CA. Martin was born April 28, 1931, in Klamath Falls, OR, to Lloyd and Bobbiette Gift. There were 4 children, Mary Noble, Hazel O’Keefe, Martin, and Edith Walsh. He was raised on a ranch in Langell Valley, OR, and went to the Bonanza Schools. Martin married Donna (Dixon) from the Henley area on October 30, 1954, at the Mt. Laki Church, south of Klamath Falls. They had 4 children, Robin, Ronnie, Todd and Connie. In 1966 Martin, Donna and their young family moved to the family ranch near laqua (approximately 30 miles from Eureka, CA). This is the same ranch that was homesteaded by Martin’s great-grandparents in the 1800’s. On this ranch Martin, Donna and the “hired men”, their kids, learned every square inch by riding horses gathering cattle with dogs in tow. Martin not only taught his children and grandchildren to rope while spring branding but taught other friends and the children also. He leaves his legacy of horsemanship and love of dogs with all that knew and loved him....”



A7- Sylvester “Ves” McBride—was born 24 August, 1902 to Charles Edwin and Fannie Louise (James) McBride in Cache, Paradise County, Utah. He married Ruth Shaw on 12 April, 1956 in Humboldt County, California. He died 2 October, 1966 in an automobile accident near Kneeland Road.

The *Eureka Humboldt Standard* of 3 October, 1966 reported his accident:

“Ves McBride Killed On Ranch Road

Sylvester “Ves” McBride, prominent Kneeland rancher was killed about 1:30 p.m. Sunday afternoon when his pickup truck ran off a private road on the ranch three and one-half miles south of Kneeland Road.

McBride, 64, was pinned beneath the vehicle after it went over an embankment and rolled on top of him.

The body was discovered by his wife, Mrs. Ruth Gift McBride, and Mr. and Mrs. Ed Brown, address unlisted at 2:15 p.m. Time of the accident was estimated by the distance from the point where McBride had stopped to converse with friends after investigating some shooting on another part of the ranch.

Two sheriff’s deputies and ambulance and a tow truck were dispatched from Eureka, with the truck lifting the wreck off the victim.

The body was taken to Sanders Mortuary here for funeral arrangements.

Investigating deputies long acquainted with McBride and his family, said he may have suffered some sudden physical upset, or had his attention momentarily diverted.

The tragedy occurred about a quarter mile from the ranch house.”

His obituary in the Eureka *Humboldt Standard* on 4 October, 1966 gives further reference to family members:

"McBride, Sylvester, Oct. 2, 1966, Kneeland. Husband of Mrs. Ruth McBride of Kneeland. Father of Dean McBride of Lacombe, Wallace McBride of Concord, Calif., Mrs. Peggy Polza Vega of La Paz, Bolivia. Brother of Mrs. Jenny Rich of Logan, Utah, Ray, Grant, and Ronald McBride, all of Pinger, Utah. Lived in this area for 16 years. Member of Humboldt County and California Cattlemen's Association. A native of Utah. Age 64. Services will be held at Sanders Funeral Home ... under the auspices of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints. Interment services will be at Iaqua Cemetery ..."



A8-Ruth Estella (Shaw) Gift McBride—was born on 16 September, 1904 to Thomas Jacob, Jr. and Johanna Marie (Olsen) Shaw at Shower's Pass. She married George F. Gift on 15 September, 1927 at Eureka, California. She married Sylvester McBride on 12 April, 1956. She died 16 May, 1992.

Her obituary in the *Times Standard* reads:

"Ruth Gift McBride, a resident of Eureka and native of Iaqua, died May 16, 1992.

Ruth, a lifelong resident of Humboldt County was born September 16, 1904 to Thomas J. Shaw and Johanna Olsen Shaw of the Pioneer Jacob Shaw and Gustave Olsen families who homesteaded the Iaqua and Showers Pass areas in the late 1800s.

Ruth spent her working life running the George Gift Ranch and the Tom Shaw cattle ranch, where her father was born in a log cabin and lived his entire life.

Ruth is survived by her sister Anita Goldschmidt, her aunt, Sarah T. Hoelling; and numerous nieces, nephews and cousins.

Ruth was preceded in death by her first husband George Gift in 1950 and her second husband Sylvester McBride in 1966.

Graveside services will be held ... at Iaqua Cemetery ...



A9-George Fremont Gift—was born 9 October, 1901 to John Henry and Anna C. (Jewett) Gift in Eureka. On 15 September, 1927 in Eureka, he was married to Ruth E. Shaw on 15 September, 1927. He died 1 September, 1950.

This article was in the *Humboldt Times* of 3 September, 1950:

"Funeral Set for George F. Gift

Funeral services for George Fremont Gift, 47 year old Iaqua rancher who died late Friday night, will be held at the Pierce chapel ... Rev. James Senter officiating and interment at the Iaqua cemetery.

"Guy Breshears of Eureka Succumbs

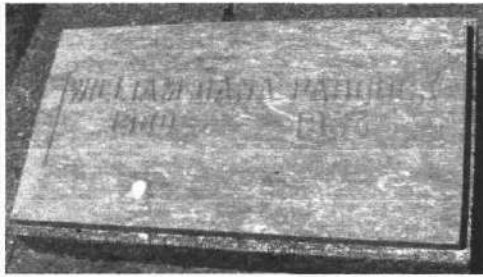

"Sterling Fulmore Paddock was born at home in Eureka on April 11, 1910, weighing just a little over 2 lbs. He was put in a shoe box in the warming oven in the old wood stove. He was not expected to survive. He passed away on February 27, 2008; just 44 days shy of his 98th birthday.

He spent his youth working on various ranches in Humboldt and Siskiyou County. He enjoyed many years of deer hunting and fishing. His hobbies were rock hunting and collecting petrified wood.

In his later life he spent many hours helping out local ranchers...Often staying at their home to feed the animals or making wood for them and house sitting when they went on vacation. It was said he was very reliable and nothing was ever out of place when they returned home.

Sterling was a quiet and private individual and lived in his own home until his brief stay at St. Luke Manor.

Her death occurred sometime after the birth of her son, David, in January of 1882 and certainly before the second marriage of her husband in July of 1885. Charles Shepherd remarried to Mary Emma Brown and went on to have an additional eight children. Mrs. Shepherd has the notoriety of being the grandmother of James Harold "Jimmy" Doolittle of aviation and WWII fame by her daughter Rosa Cerenah, whose second marriage was to Frank Henry Doolittle. Adelia does not seem to be related to Sarah Ann Fox who married William Erwin.

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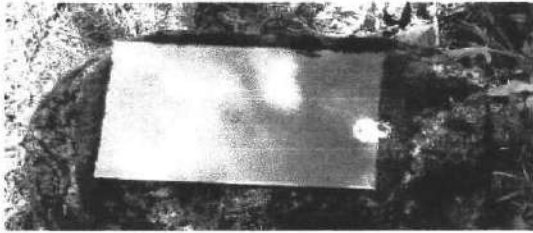

B1-Mrs. Long—At this time there is no known information about Mrs. Long.



B2-Henry Frank Chandler—was born about 1869 in Illinois and died 6 November, 1923 at the County Hospital in Eureka, Humboldt County, California, of heart disease. (In the 1910 census, which is the first census that I found him enumerated in, it is stated that his parents are from Scotland). He married Ida Bell Adams about 1900. He and Ida had seven children, Fred, Clifton, Milton, Ellery, Alice (Harrison), Bessie (Svendsen) and Hazel (Flint).

This article appeared in the *Humboldt Standard* of 7 November, 1923:

"Death Ends Trial of Father and Son Here

Frank Chandler dies in the County Hospital and Fred Dismissed in Court

Death, last night, brought an end to the trial of Frank and Fred Chandler, father and son, charged with the manufacture of intoxicating liquor, when Frank Chandler, the father, died in the county hospital.

The charge against the son, Fred Chandler, was dismissed last night, on request of District Attorney Arthur E. Hill, and he was released from the county jail as soon as it was learned that the father was dead.

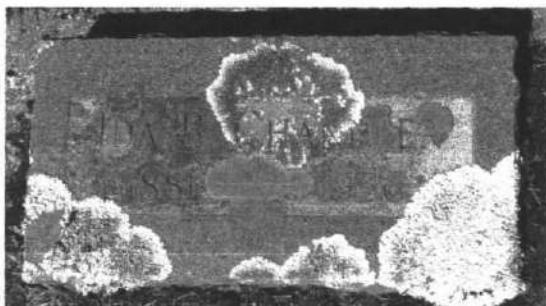
BOTH WERE ARRESTED

Both the father and son were arrested by the county dry squad, during a raid in the laqua district about three weeks ago. A large still was found hidden on the bank of a creek near the Chandler home. The father and son were charged with manufacturing whiskey and were bound over to the superior court at the justice court preliminary.

Both men were held in the county jail pending the furnishing of \$1,000 cash bail each. Monday, Frank Chandler was stricken suddenly ill, and was removed to the county hospital here he died last night from a complication of infirmities.

CARES FOR THE FAMILY

Through the death of his father, Fred Chandler, who is only about 21 years of age, now becomes the head and the main support of a large family. He promised District Attorney Hill last night that he would return to the Chandler home, near laqua and look after the welfare of the family and the case against him was dismissed."



B3-Ida Bell (Adams) Chandler—was born 6 March 1880 in Brentwood, Contra Costa County, California. (She is enumerated in the 1880 Contra Costa County Census as 4 months old, so she could not have been born in 1881 as the California Death Records and her obituary states). Her parents were Alonzo and Mary J. (Sullenger) Adams. She died 27 July, 1956.

Her obituary in the *Humboldt Standard* of 28 July, 1956 reads:

"Ida B. Chandler, age 75, of McKinleyville died Friday afternoon in a local hospital. She was born March 6, 1881 [1880] in Contra Costa County and had lived the past 54 years in Humboldt County, 30 of which she resided at Iaquia.

She is survived by four sons, Clifton Chandler of Korbey, Fred Chandler, of Eureka, Milton Chandler, of Santa Cruz and Ellery Chandler of Santa Clara; three daughter, Mrs. Alice Harrison of McKinleyville, Mrs. Bessie Svendsen of Fortuna, and Mrs. Hazel Flint of Sacramento; two brothers, Pete Adams of Orangeville, California and Albert Adams of Yountville, California; two sisters Mrs. Bessie Marsten and Mrs. Flora Marsten both of Bright, California. Also several grandchildren and great grandchildren. Funeral services will be held ... at Field Mortuary, Chapel of the Redwood in Arcata with Rev. Warren M. Davis officiating. Interment will be at Iaquia."



B4- Fred Raymond Chandler—was born in Eureka 21 March, 1902 to Henry Frank and Ida B. (Adams) Chandler. He died 26 March, 1958 of a heart attack.

His obituary in the Eureka *Humboldt Standard* of 27 March, 1958 reads:

"Fred Raymond Chandler, 56, died Wednesday as the result of a heart attack while working on the Thomas

Shaw ranch at Iaquia, near Kneeland. He was born March 21, 1902 in Eureka.

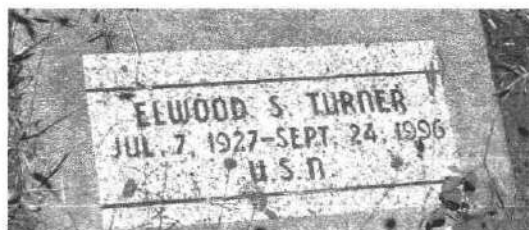

"Elwood S. Turner died Sept. 24, 1996 in Eureka at the age of 69. He was a native and resident of Eureka.

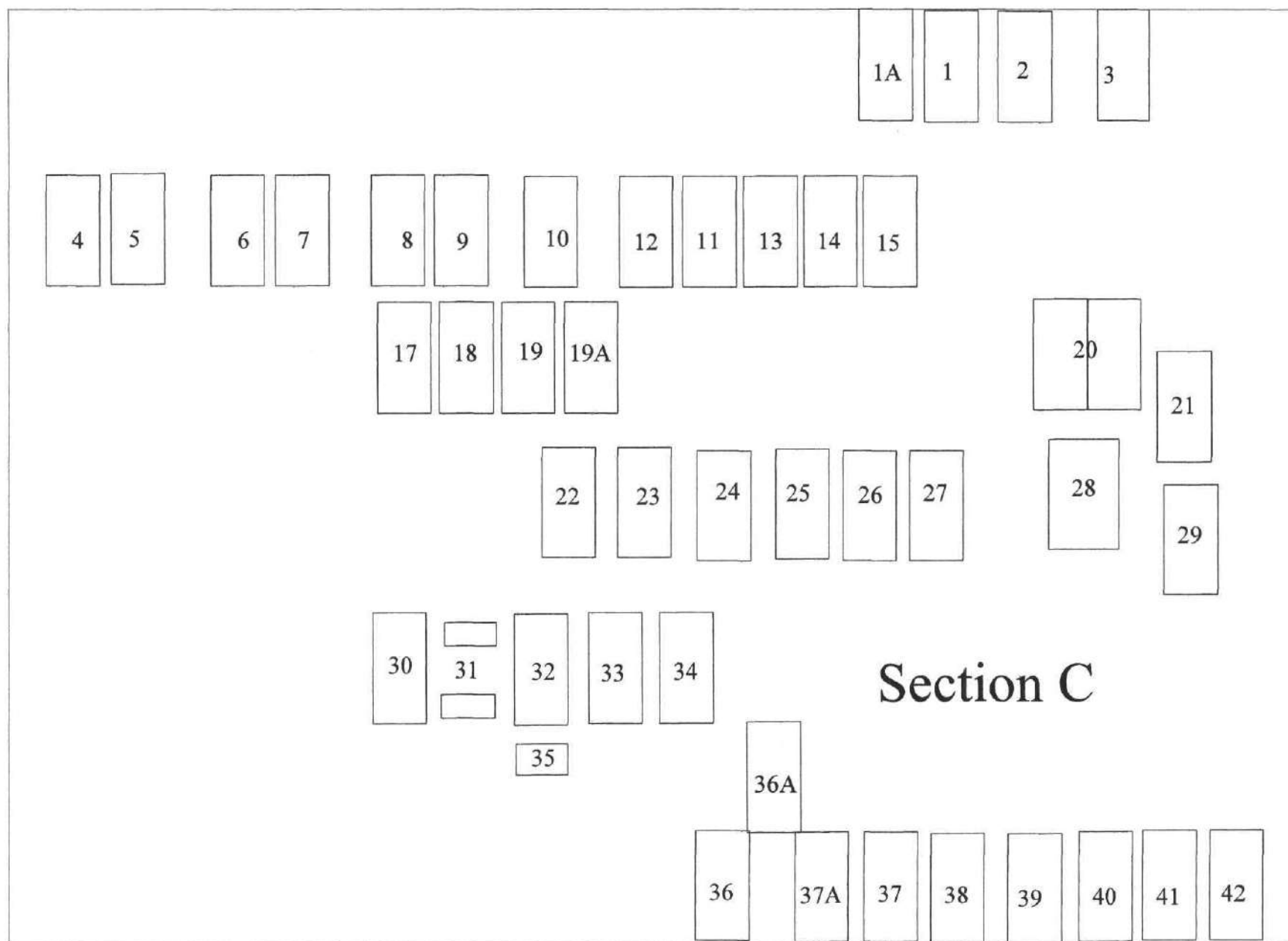

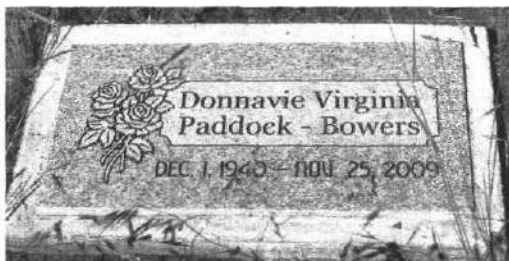

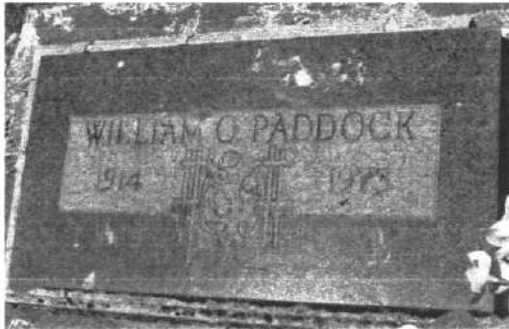

(Lucille) Vancel James and Mrs. Irene Ivory both of Othello, Wa.; grandfather of Candice and Will Paddock both of Eureka. He is also survived by numerous nieces and nephews.

Mr. Paddock was a native of Eureka, and had spent some of his preschool years in San Francisco and completed his elementary and high school education in the San Francisco area. He returned to Humboldt County when he was 18 and lived the rest of his life in this area. Mr. Paddock had operated a ranch in Kneeland for many years. Age 59.

Services were held at the Chapel of the Ferns, Cooper Mortuary... with the Rev. James M. Brown of the Eureka First Presbyterian Church officiating. Concluding services were at Iaqua Cemetery.

C3- Amos Frame—was born 29 September, 1832 in Somerset, Pennsylvania to Amos and Elizabeth Ann Frame. He married Luvanda Lindley on 26 February, 1863 in the Eel River Valley, Humboldt County, California and died 1 July, 1895 at laqua. He came to Humboldt County in 1850. The laqua Cemetery was originally part of the Frame Ranch. Luvanda (Lindley) Frame was born 26 February, 1846 in Missouri to Elihu and Martha (Darnell) Lindley. She died 7 September, 1925 in Eureka, where she is also buried.

This brief mention appeared *Arcata Union*, 6 July 1895:

"AMOS FRAME, one of our earliest pioneers, died at laqua, on Saturday last. Deceased came to the bay in the schooner that entered the mouth of the Eel river in 1850, where a town was laid off."



C3- Loleta Frame—was born about 1878/79 at laqua to Amos and Luvanda (Lindley) Frame. She died 6 February 1888 at the "Finson House" hotel in Eureka, California at the age of 9 years.

This notice appeared the *Humboldt Times* of 9 February, 1888:

"Died
FRAME—At the Finson House, in this city, February 6th, Lolita, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Amos Frame of laqua, aged 9 years."



C4 and C5- Harris Children—were born to Joseph Albert, who was born August of 1861 in Canada, and Belle Harris, who was born March of 1866 in California. They later located to the San Francisco area and eventually to Humboldt County, California. The graves of the children are marked only with wooden crosses so it is unknown which grave is whose.

Son—was born 3 May 1893 at laqua and died 9 May 1893 at laqua.

The birth and death notices appeared in the 20 May 1893 issue of the *Arcata Union*:

"Harris—At laqua, May 3, 1893, to the wife of Joseph Harris, a son."

"Harris—At laqua, May 9, 1893, the infant son of Joe and Belle Harris, aged 6 days."

Nina Claressa—was born about 2 July 1890 and died 2 April 1893 at the age of 2 years and nine months.

This notice appeared in the *Arcata Union* 15 April 1893:

"Harris—At laqua, April 2, 1893, Nina Claressa, youngest daughter of Joseph and Belle Harris, aged 2 years and 9 months.



C6-Baby Fredrickson—a girl was stillborn on 8 January, 1909 to Thorwald and Irene (Erwin) Fredrickson.



C7-Lorene Johnson—was born 14 January, 1900 to John and Mary Ann (Fredrickson) Johnson at laqua. She died 7 July 1900 at laqua of pneumonia.

This notice appeared the *Ferndale Enterprise* on 13 July, 1900:

"Died, at laqua, July 7th, Lorene infant daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John Johnson, aged 5 months and 24 days."



C8-William Galbraith Curry—was born 30 November, 1840 in Jerome, Union County, Ohio to Robert Burns and Sarah (Beard) Curry. He married Mary Elizabeth Gardner on 19 January of 1865. He died 2 October, 1906 at laqua. He was a veteran of the Civil War and a member of Company G 4th Kansas Light Artillery.

This obituary appeared in the *Daily Times* on 3 October, 1906:

"Had Lived Long In Humboldt

G.W. Curry, a pioneer rancher of Humboldt, and a veteran of the Civil War, died at his home near laqua at 6 o'clock yesterday morning of heart trouble, with which he had been affected for many years. The deceased was 66 years of age and for the past ten years had resided near laqua. Prior to his residence in that section, he was an esteemed citizen of the valley. Mr. Curry is mourned by a widow, three daughters, and two sons. The daughters are

Miss Mabel Curry, of laqua; Mrs. G.B. Smith of Willow Creek, and Mrs. S. Foster, of Kneeland Prairie. The sons are W.O. Curry, of Blue Lake and Allen Curry of Kneeland.

A casket was secured from M. Engles yesterday and will be taken to laqua today, where the funeral will be held ..."

This article appeared later in the 11 October, 1906 *Daily Times*"

"Death Causes Vacancy—The death of W.G. Curry of laqua, leaves a vacancy on the Republican ticket in that township, as the gentleman was the nominee of the party for justice of the peace. It is probable that the committee on vacancies will secure another candidate."



C9-Alexander Parker Phillips—was born 31 March, 1899 in Eureka, California to Alexander Parker and Amy May (Huestis) Phillips. He drowned while swimming in Yager Creek near Fort Baker, California on 15 August, 1914.

An Article regarding his death was in the *Humboldt Standard* of August 17, 1914:

"Drowns in Yager Creek
Alex Phillips is Victim of Cramps
While Swimming with Three Other Boys Suddenly Gives Up—
Body Was Found Yesterday

Rendered helpless either by cramps or too great a depth of water, Alexander Phillips, 15 years of age was drowned in Yager creek at a point two miles east of Fort Baker early Saturday evening. The body was not recovered until yesterday morning at which time, after an inquest under the direction of Coroner Henry A. Hansen, the body was prepared for burial by an embalmer sent out from the Oliver-Sanders mortuary parlors in this city. The funeral will be held tomorrow afternoon from the home the boy's parents on Kneeland Prairie.

In company with two brothers, Olson by name and John Bertain of this city, Phillips went to Yager creek on Saturday and made camp it being the intention to spend several days hunting. Early in the evening the boys went in swimming in a deep hole and were enjoying the sport when with a cry, Phillips sank from sight in some ten or twelve feet of water. Efforts to aid him were without avail.

Approaching darkness made it impossible to recover the body that evening and it was not taken from the water until the following morning.

Beside the father and mother living at Kneeland Prairie, deceased is survived by two sisters, who are employed as nurses at the Sequoia Hospital in this city."



C-10-John and Mary Ann (Fredrickson) Johnson—John was born 1 April, 1849 in Sweden. He married Mary Ann Fredrickson on 30 April, 1889 in Eureka, California. He died 1 October, 1919 at laqua of kidney disease.

This brief article appeared in *The Humboldt Times* on 2 October, 1919:

"John Johnson of laqua Dies

John Johnson, for the past 30 years a resident of the laqua district, died at his home there yesterday following a short illness brought on by a slight cold. The deceased who was 70 years of

age, is survived by his wife, five daughters and one son. The funeral will be held Friday afternoon at Iaqua."

In another article on 4 October, 1919, in the *Humboldt Times*:

"IAQUA; Oct. 3—John Johnson died her October 1. He had long been a farmer here. He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Mary Johnson, a son Charles and three (sic) daughters, Mrs. James Dunn and Edna Mae, Ellen and Mabel Johnson."



Mary Ann was born 27 February, 1866 in Melbourne, Australia to James P. and Amelia (Negus) Fredrickson. She married John Johnson on 30 April, 1889 in Eureka. She died 8 March, 1954 after a long illness.

Her obituary in the *Humboldt Standard* of 9 March, 1954 reads:

"Mary Ann Johnson, 88 of Iaqua died Monday night in a local hospital after a long illness. She was a daughter of the pioneer family of James P. Fredrickson. Born in Melbourne, Australia, February 27, 1866, she arrived with her parents by sailing vessel in San Francisco at the age of one year. Three years later she came with her parents to a ranch at Iaqua and has lived all of her life in this vicinity. In April, 1889, she married John Johnson who died in 1919.

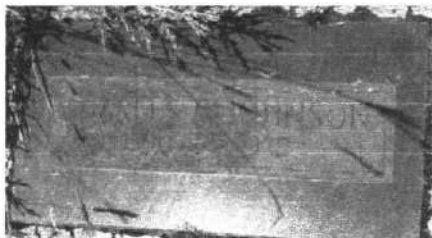
She is survived by a son Charles E. Johnson, of Iaqua, five daughters, Edna A. Berry of Iaqua, Verna I. Dunn and Mrs. Carlton B. Petterson, both of Eureka, Mrs. Earl E. C-11-Charles Edward Johnson—born 28 July, 1890 at Iaqua, Humboldt County, California to John and Mary Ann (Fredrickson) Johnson. He married Edna "Audrey" Phillips. He died on 3 October, 1972 in Eureka.

His obituary in the *Times Standard* of 4 October, 1972 reads:

"Johnson, Charles Edward a long time resident and rancher in Iaqua died October 3, 1972 in Eureka. Husband of Audrey P. Johnson of Iaqua. Brother of Mrs. Edna Berry of Kneeland; Mrs. Henry (Verna) Pederson of Eureka; Mrs. Carlton (Mae) Pettersen of Eureka; Mrs. Earl (Ellen) Lindley of Redwood Valley; Mrs. Samuel (Mabel) Clark of Eureka. Uncle of Mr. Dale Lindley of Cupertino; Mrs. Eunice Clifton of Anderson; Mrs. Laila Williams of Sacramento. Cousin of Erwin Fredrickson of Eureka. He is also survived by numerous other relatives.

A native of Humboldt County, aged 82. Mr. Johnson was a member of the Cattlemen's Assn., a 50 year member of the Woolgrowers Assn., a member of the Humboldt County Pioneers, the Humboldt County Historical Society, the Freshwater Grange and the Farm Bureau.

Services will be held at the Chapel of Pierce Mortuary ... with the Reverend John Thompson officiating. Interment will be in Iaqua Cemetery. Casket bearers will be the Thomas Cosgrove, George Dysert, Kay Stapp, John Rice, Jerry Mullen, Erwin Fredrickson, Roy Stapp. Honorary bearers will be Jack Shaw, Ernest Lampella, Roy Fulton, Einar Bjorkstrand and Pat Fulton."



C12- Edna "Audrey" (Phillips) Johnson—born on 3 February, 1897 in Eureka to Alexander Parker and Amy May (Huestis) Phillips. She married Charles E. Johnson. She died on her 90th birthday, 3 February, 1977.

Her obituary in the *Times Standard* of 5 February, 1977 reads:

"Johnson, Audrey, resident of Kneeland, Feb. 3, 1977. She was the widow of the late Charles E. Johnson who preceded her in death in 1972.

She was the sister of Eva Gillis, Gasquet; Laura Williams, Gasquet; Sadie Azevedo, San Mateo; aunt of Robert J. Gillis, Manila, P.I.; Mary Mausser, San Carlos; Patricia Roberts, Sacramento; Naida Gipson, Portland, Ore.; Betty Clayborn, San Mateo; George Phillips and Theodore Phillips, both of San Francisco.

Mrs. Johnson was a native of Eureka. She was a 50 year member of the Order of the Eastern Star; Humboldt Cowbells Association; Humboldt County Historical Society.

Funeral Services will be held at Pierce Mortuary Chapel... with the Rev. John I. Thompson officiating. Private Interment in Iaqua Cemetery.

Honorary casketbearers will be Tom Cosgrove, George Dysert, Erwin Fredrickson, Ernest Lampella, Sterling Paddock, Jerry Mullen..."





C13—James Peter Fredrickson—was born 15 August, 1828 near Copenhagen, Denmark (on the Island of Bonrholm, Denmark) to Mr. and Mrs. Frederick Otterman. He married Amelia Negus in April, 1865 in Australia. He died 22 December, 1901.

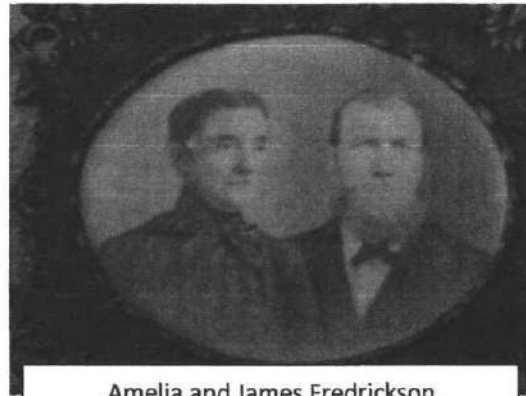
From the "History of Humboldt County" we find this biography:

"...Among the early settlers of Iaqua, Humboldt county, is the Fredrickson family. The elder Fredrickson, James P., was born on the Island of Borholm, Denmark, August 15, 1828. He went to sea when a lad and followed that occupation for many years, sailing into many foreign ports. Three years were spent in seal fishing in the Arctic ocean off the coast of Greenland and Spitzbergen. At the time of the excitement caused by the discovery of gold in California he came around Cape Horn on a sailer as man before the mast and on his arrival in San Francisco he left the ship and started for the mines, which he followed for some time, being reasonably successful. After

which he returned to Denmark.

However, his taste for adventure and exploring was not satisfied, so he started on a journey to Australia, where after following prospecting and mining in that wilderness he went to New Zealand, and from there to California. In 1865 he arrived in Humboldt county, and for a few years he lived in Eureka, farming and lumbering.

In October, 1870, James P. Fredrickson located in the Iaqua district, purchasing three hundred twenty acres of school land, and began the nucleus of a large and successful ranching

experience. He also homesteaded one hundred sixty acres. He built a house and made needed improvement. He also ran a dairy of twenty-five to thirty cows, panning, skimming and churning by hand, the butter being hauled to Eureka and shipped to San Francisco. He purchased land adjoining until his ranch comprised seven hundred sixty acres at the time of his death in 1901.

James P. Fredrickson was married while living in Australia, in April, 1865, his wife being Amelia Negus, who was a native of Essex county, England. She died leaving five children, as follows: Mary, the wife of John Johnson, of Iaqua; Thorwald, of Iaqua, Victoria A., Mrs. M.F. Shook, who died at Iaqua; William H., a partner of Thorwald; and Henrietta A., who resides in Eureka...."

This lengthy obituary appeared in the 24 December, 1901 *Daily Times*:

"SUMMONS COMES TO AGED IAQUA RANCHER

James P. Fredrickson, a Pioneer Rancher of That Section, Breathes His Last.

FREDRICKSON—At Iaqua, December 22, 1901, James Peter, beloved husband of Amelia Fredrickson, and father of Mrs. J. Johnson, Mrs. M.F. Shook, Thorwald, William H. and Henrietta A. Fredrickson, a native of Denmark, aged 73 years 4 months and 7 days.

[Funeral services to be held at the family residence at Iaqua, at 2 p.m. Tuesday afternoon]

James P. Fredrickson was born in Copenhagen, Denmark, August 15, 1823. When but a mere boy he left his native home to follow the sea. During that period he made three voyages to the whale and seal fisheries of Baffin bay and the Arctic, going as far north at latitude 82 degrees. Being able to receive better pay on his return home, he joined an English merchant fleet, and while with it made his first trip to the United States, then finding it more profitable, he join the American merchant fleet. During his sojourn with it and the English merchant fleet, he visited many of the important sea ports of the world, having sailed on the waters of four great oceans, and the Mediterranean and Black Seas and in the Gulf of Mexico, and up the Mississippi river.

When the gold excitement broke out in California, he sailed around Cape Horn, and after being nearly shipwrecked, arrived in San Francisco early in 1851, immediately leaving there for the gold fields in El Dorado county.

Leaving California in 1855, he made an extensive visit to his old home; crossing the Isthmus to Greytown, thence sailing from there to New York and from there to Copenhagen. While there, hearing of newly discovered gold mines in Australia, he turned his footsteps thither. During his stay here, he met the lady of his choice, and was married in 1865. Leaving there the following year and coming back to California, he arrived in Eureka in the fall of 1866, where he was engaged in different occupations, trying for awhile the redwoods, where he was severely injured almost losing his life. As soon as he was able to get about, he moved to Iaqua, which was then just beginning to be settled, where he had remained ever since, having built himself up a comfortable home at which place his death occurred.

He leaves to mourn his loss, wife, two sons, and two daughters, who reside at and near Iaqua."



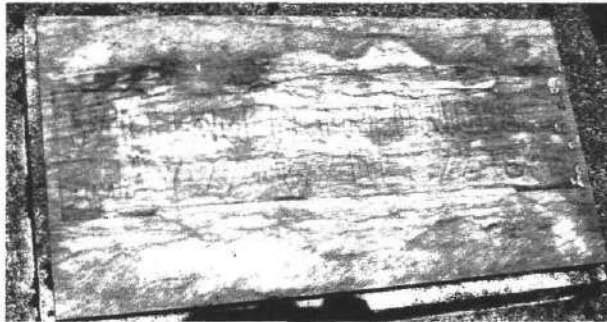
C14-Amelia (Negus) Fredrickson—was born about 1841 in Essex, England. She married James P. Fredrickson in April 1865 in Australia. She died 9 June 1909 in Eureka.

Her obituary in the *Daily Standard* of 10 June 1909 reads:

"Another pioneer woman of Humboldt has answered the last summons, Mrs. Amelia Fredrickson, who passed away at her home at Seventeenth and Harrison avenue last night, at the ripe age of 70 years. Deceased was the relict of James P. Fredrickson a well known rancher of Iaqua, who was a California pioneer of 1850 and with his wife came to this county in 1866. They settled at Iaqua in 1871 where the Fredrickson place has become one of the largest sheep ranches of that part of the county. Since her husband's death, about eight years ago, Mrs. Fredrickson had been in failing health but it was only since the beginning of this year that the rapid decline set in which culminated last night in her death. A year or so ago Mrs. Fredrickson purchased the home here and since then with her daughter, Miss Henrietta had been a resident of this city.

Deceased was a native of Essex England, but when about 13 years of age was taken by her parents to Australia and there she met and married her husband. Besides the daughter named she leaves three other children, two sons, Thorwald and Wm. H. Fredrickson and Mrs. John Johnson, all of the home place at Iaqua. The body will be kept here until Saturday morning when it will be taken to Iaqua for interment that afternoon on the home place, beside the husband and a child buried there.

The body will lie in state at the home on Harrison avenue tomorrow where friends are invited to come and take their last look upon the face of the dead pioneer woman."



C15- William H. Fredrickson—born 27 May, 1877 at Iaqua to James P. and Amelia (Negus) Fredrickson. He died 22 December, 1944 at the General Hospital in Eureka, California of a stomach ulcer. He was a partner with his brother, Thorwald, in a ranch at Iaqua. He was single.

This brief article appeared in the *Humboldt Standard* on 22 December, 1944:

"W.H. Fredrickson of Iaqua Dies

William H. Fredrickson of Iaqua, died this morning in a local hospital. He was born in Humboldt county 67 years ago and had lived here his entire life.

His is survived by his sisters Mrs. Mary Johnson of Iaqua, Miss Etta Fredrickson of Eureka, and his brother, Thorwald Fredrickson of Iaqua.

Pierce Mortuary is directing funeral arrangements."

C17- Ellen Hyacinth (Johnson) Lindley—was born 6 August, 1901 in Eureka, Humboldt County, California to John and Mary Ann (Fredrickson) Johnson she married Earl Edwin Lindley. She died 25 March, 1991 in Eureka. Earl was born 26 July 1905 and died 6 April, 1980.

Ellen's obituary in the *Times Standard* reads:

"Ellen H. Lindley died March 25, 1991, in Eureka at age 89. She was a native and resident of Eureka.

Mrs. Lindley graduated from Humboldt State Teachers College, and was proud of being a native Californian and lifelong resident of the state.

She is survived by her son and his spouse, Dale C. and Caroline Lindley of Cupertino; her sister and a brother-in-law, Mae Petterson of Eureka and Mabel and Samuel Clark of Eureka; her grandchildren, Scott E. Lindley of Cupertino and Douglas A. Lindley of Sacramento; and her nieces, Eunice Clifton and Laila Williams of Redding. She is also survived by numerous grandnieces and grandchildren. She was preceded in death by her husband, Earl E. Lindley, in 1980; and a brother, Charles E. Johnson; and two sisters, Edna Berry and Verna Pederson.

At Mrs. Lindley's request, no services will be held.

C18-Verna Isabel (Johnson) Pederson— was born 15 March, 1895 at laqua to John and Mary Ann (Fredrickson) Johnson. She died 2 April, 1987. She first married Rupert Nelson Dunn on 23 June, 11 in Eureka. She married second Henry Pederson. Henry Pederson died 18 September, 1975 and is buried at Ocean View Cemetery.

Verna's obituary in the *Times Standard* of 5 April, 1987 reads:

"Verna I. Pederson

Private family services were held Friday for Verna I. Pederson who died April 2, 1987, in Eureka. She was a resident of Eureka.

Mrs. Pederson retired from the Poultry Producers of Northern California in 1967. Born in laqua, she taught school in a one-room schoolhouse in the mountains during her early life. She was a member of the pioneer Johnson and Fredrickson families of Kneeland. She was a member of Azalea Shrine No. 47, White Shrine of Jerusalem, and a former member of the Business and Professional Women (B.P.W.)

Mrs. Pederson is survived by her sisters, Edna Berry of Anderson, Calif., Mae Pettersen, Ellen Lindley, and Mabel Clark, all of Eureka, her nieces and nephews, Eunice Clifton of Anderson and Dale Lindley of Cupertino, Calif., and her cousin, Erwin Fredrickson of Eureka. She was preceded in death by her husband, Henry Pederson in September 1975 and her brother, Charles Johnson.

Private family services were held ... at Pierce Chapel with the Rev. W. Douglas Thompson officiating. Inurnment is at laqua Cemetery, laqua."



C19-Victoria Mae (Johnson) Petterson—was born 25 May, 1897 at laqua to John and Mary Ann (Fredrickson) Johnson. She married Carlton B. Petterson. She died 18 April, 1994.



C19A-Mabel M. (Johnson) Clark—was born 19 December, 1905 at laqua to John and Mary Ann (Fredrickson) Johnson. She married Samuel J. Clark on 26 January, 1944. She died 23 June, 1998.

Her obituary in the *Times Standard* reads:

"Mable M. Clark passed away June 23, 1998 in Redding.

Born Dec. 19, 1905 at the family ranch at laqua in Humboldt County. She married Samuel J. Clark on Jan. 26, 1944. Mabel was the daughter of Mary Ann and John Johnson, and the granddaughter of Amelia and James Fredrickson, all pioneer ranchers of the laqua area.

She was preceded in death by her husband, Samuel J. Clark; her brother Charles E. Johnson; and four sisters, Edna Berry, Verna Pederson, Mae Petterson and Ellen Lindley.

She is survived by her niece, Eunice M. Clifton and husband, Irwin "Bud" Clifton of Anderson; her nephew and his wife, Dale C. and Caroline Lindley; her cousin Erwin and his wife, June Fredrickson; and James Fredrickson; several grandnieces and nephews, Mary Ann, Tracy, Larry Williams, Sandra Palmer, Russell and Dan Williams, and Scott and Douglas Lindley.

At her request, no services will be held.

Interment will be at the family plot at the laqua Cemetery in Humboldt County...."



C20-Victoria A. (Fredrickson) Shook and Marion Franklin Shook

Victoria Amelia (Fredrickson) Shook was born about 10 March, 1871 at laqua to James P. and Amelia (Negus) Fredrickson. She married Marion Franklin Shook on 13 March, 1896 at laqua. She died in childbirth at laqua on 23 December, 1897.

This notice appeared in the *Arcata Union* of 25 December, 1897:

"Died

SHOOK—At laqua, Dec. 23, 1897, Victoria, beloved wife of Marion F. Shook, and daughter of J.P. Fredrickson, a native of California."

Marion Franklin Shook was born about 1854 in Missouri to Charles F. and Frances A. (Roark) Shook. He married Victoria A. Fredrickson on 13 March, 1896 at laqua. He died 15 October, 1914 at laqua. He left one daughter Viola Marion.

This short article appeared in The *Humboldt Times* 17 October, 1914:

"Marion Shook Taken By Death

Kneeland Rancher is Stricken When Walking Near His Home

Marion Shook, for many years a well known rancher of the Kneeland Prairie section, dropped dead about a quarter of a mile from his home Thursday night at 10 o'clock. Coroner H.A. Hansen will go to laqua this forenoon to hold the inquest.

For some time deceased and been suffering with rheumatism and was also afflicted with heart trouble. The latter malady is believed to have caused his death.

One daughter, Miss Viola Shook and a brother residing in Oregon are left to mourn his passing. Arrangements have been made to hold the funeral ... at laqua. Interment to be in the laqua cemetery."





C21-George W. Shaw—was born 24 April, 1876 at Eureka to Thomas Jacob and Mary Ann (McCord) Shaw. He died at the Tuberculosis School in Eureka on 21 July, 1928. He was single.

This notice appeared *Humboldt Standard* 23 July, 1928:

"SHAW—In this city, on July 21st, 1928, George W. Shaw beloved son of Mrs. Mary Shaw and loving brother of Thomas J. Shaw and L.M. Shaw all of Iaqua, Rienza S. Shaw of Bridgeville, Mrs. J. C. Walling of Fresno, Mrs. Stella Severns of Freshwater, Mrs. Flora Baker of Livingston, Mrs. Marion Rousseau of Blue Lake, Mrs. Elizabeth Horrell and Mrs. Dixie Horrell of this city; a native of California, aged 52 years 2 months and 28 days.

Friends and acquaintances are respectfully invited to attend the funeral ... at the Iaqua Cemetery, Iaqua, California."



C22-Thorwald "Tob" Fredrickson—was born 13 June, 1868 in Eureka to James P. and Amelia (Negus) Fredrickson. He married Irene Erwin on 10 December, 1907 in Eureka. He died 4 April, 1946 of diabetes.

The "History of Humboldt County" has this to say about he and his brother.

"...Thorwald and William H. Fredrickson, who are engaged in farming and stock raising on their ranch at Iaqua, are both native sons of Humboldt county, Thorwald having been born in Eureka, June 13, 1868, and William H. at Iaqua May 27, 1877. They received their education in the local school, Thorwald's education being supplemented with a course at the Eureka Business College, where he was graduated in 1890. Subsequently he followed clerking and also logging for a time. After the death of the father the brothers began stock raising in partnership and have continued together ever since, an arrangement that has been carried on in peace and harmony, the brothers having entire confidence in each other.

In 1902 they purchase their present ranch of one thousand acres on the Iaqua road, where they make their home, besides operating two hundred sixty acres of the old home ranch, the whole being devoted to raising hay, grain and cattle, in which they have been successful and are building up a splendid herd of beef cattle. They also engage in threshing, operating a power threshing machine during the season. The improvements have been made with an outlook to permanency, having substantial residence and barns and the ranch is well watered, and taken as a whole is splendidly adapted for the purpose to which it is devoted.

Thorwald Fredrickson married Irene Erwin, a native of Petrolia, and they have two children, Lois and Ruth. For five years he was a member of the board of trustees of Iaqua district and was clerk of the board, while William H. is now serving his second term in the same position. Fraternally both brothers are members of Humboldt Lodge No. 77, I.O.O.F., as well as Thelma Lodge of Rebekahs, in Eureka, being active in the philanthropies of the order, besides being liberal and charitable in public movements for the upbuilding of the community and the betterment of its citizens. Politically they are staunch Republicans."

This brief article appeared in the *Humboldt Times* of 7 April, 1946:

"Fredrickson Rites Will Be Held Today

The funeral services for Thorwold Fredrickson will be held at ... in the Pierces chapel under the auspices of Humboldt lodge of Odd Fellows. Rev. J. Eldon Anderson will officiate and interment will be in the Iaqua cemetery, with the Odd Fellows conducting the service."



C23-Irene (Erwin) Fredrickson—was born 6 August, 1880 to William Smith and Sarah Ann (Fox) Erwin in Petrolia, Humboldt County, California. She married Thorwald Fredrickson on 10 December, 1907 in Eureka, Humboldt County, California. She died 10 March, 1965.

Her obituary from the *Eureka Humboldt Standard* of 11 March, 1965 reads:

"Fredrickson, Irene Erwin—March 10, 1965, Iaqua. She was preceded in death by her husband Thorwald Fredrickson and a daughter, Lowys Swearingen. Mother of Mrs. Ruthe Rochat of Hayward, Erwin Fredrickson of Kneeland. Grandmother of Duane, James and Darlene Fredrickson of Kneeland, Mrs. Beverly DeMello of Fortuna. Sister of Miss Dorsey Erwin of Eureka. She is survived by 1 nephew and several nieces and 5 great grandchildren. She had been a teacher at several of the school's in Humboldt County prior to her marriage, after which she and her husband made their home at Iaqua where they operated the Fredrickson ranch. She was a member of the Fortuna Grange 499; Pomona Grange 48, Humboldt County Pioneer Society. A native of Petrolia. Age 84. Services will be held at Pierce Mortuary... Interment at Iaqua Cemetery."



C24-Lowys Irene (Fredrickson) Swearingen—was born February 12, 1910 to Thorwald and Irene (Erwin) Fredrickson. She married first Harry Winfield Hanson on 14 December, 1929. She married second; Harold Swearingen who died 4 October, 1961. Lowys died 5 July, 1963.

Her obituary from the *Eureka Humboldt Standard* of 8 July, 1963 reads:

"Swearingen, Lowys Irene—July 6, 1963... Fortuna. Widow of Harold Swearingen. Mother of Beverly DeMello of Fortuna, Cal. Sister of Erwin Fredrickson of Kneeland, Cal., and Mrs. Ruthe Rochat of Hayward, Cal. Grandmother of Scott and Yvonne, Luis-Allen, Kenneth DeMello and Fredric DeMello of Fortuna. Aunt of Duane, James and Darlene, Fredrickson all of Kneeland. Services will be held at Pierce Mortuary... with Rev. James P. Scuter officiating."



C25- Harriet "Dorsey" Erwin—born July 1, 1875 to William Smith and Sarah Ann (Fox) Erwin in Petrolia, Humboldt County, California. She died 29 May, 1965. She was single.

Her obituary in the *Humboldt Standard* of 31 May, 1965 reads:

"Erwin, (Harriet) Dorsey—May 29, 1965, Aunt of Mrs. Ruthe Rochat of Hayward, Erwin Fredrickson of Kneeland. Great aunt of Darlene Fredrickson of Kneeland, Mrs. Beverly DeMello of Fortuna, Duane Fredrickson and James Fredrickson, both of Kneeland. Great, great aunt of: Yvonne Luis, Scot Luis, Allen, Kenneth and Frederick DeMello of Fortuna. She was preceded in death by her sister Irene Fredrickson who passed away March 1965. Served as a practical nurse for many years in East Bay area. She had lived 39 years in Humboldt County. She had spent most of her life in Oakland. A native of Petrolia, California. Age 89. Services will be held at Pierce Mortuary... with Dr. James Brown officiating. Pallbearers: Duane and James Fredrickson, George Rochat, Louis Davis, Sr., James Dubrovich, Leland Brescheer. Interment at laqua Cemetery."



C26- Jennette "Jennie" (Furman) Mullen—was born 28 June, 1886 to Mr. and Sarah M. (Porter) Furman in Nashville, Tennessee. She married William Henry Mullen 11 February, 1915 in Eureka, Humboldt County, California. She died 26 November, 1960. Her husband, William H. Mullen, was born 26 March, 1869 in Virginia City, Nevada to Jeremiah and Elizabeth (Sullivan) Mullen. He died 4 November, 1927 at laqua of heart failure. He is buried in Eureka.

Her obituary in the *Eureka Humboldt Standard* of 28 November, 1960 reads:

"Mrs. Jennie Furman Mullen died Saturday afternoon at a local hospital following a lengthy illness. She was born in Nashville, Tenn., and moved to Michigan as a small child where she attended school and moved to California to finish her education and was graduated from business college. She had been employed by a local firm for some 10 years. She married William H. Mullen and moved to the Mullen ranch at Kneeland where she continued her lodge and school activities.

She was a past noble grand of the Rebekah Lodge and was secretary of the Lodge for many years. She was noted as one of two first women drivers in Humboldt County.

William H. Mullen is not buried at laqua cemetery, but his biography in the "History of Humboldt County" is of interest because of his many years spent in that area.

William Henry Mullen—A western man, born in Virginia City, Nev., March 26, 1869, William H. Mullen, when about fifteen months old, was brought by his parents to Humboldt county, where he grew up on the old homestead on the laqua road, near Lawrence creek. His father, Jeremiah Mullen, a native of Ireland, went to sea, going on a sailer as man before the mast, to Australia, thence to Boston, returning from there to Ireland. Next he came around Cape Horn to San Francisco, where he left the ship. While working on the Woodward Gardens in San Francisco he married Elizabeth Sullivan. Following their marriage they went to Virginia City, Nev., Mr. Mullen was employed at mining on the Comstock and other lodes. He worked on the eleven hundred foot level. Wishing to engage in ranching, he came to Humboldt county with his family in the fall of 1870 and homesteaded one hundred sixty acres on Lawrence creek, twenty-five miles east of Eureka, where he engaged in stockraising. Encouraged by his success, he bought land adjoining and acquired nearly a thousand acres. He died April 16, 1898, his wife having died April 20, 1896. Of their four children the eldest, Mary, died of black measles in Virginia City, Nev., when eighteen months old. William H. is our subject; John P. is a farmer at Kneeland; and Timothy J. is a farmer on Lawrence creek.

William H. Mullen spent his childhood on the old home farm, where he acquired a knowledge of stockraising and farming. He was educated the public schools of the district, and in Eureka, and remained at home, assisting his father until the latter's death. His brother Timothy was then in Alaska and so William and his brother John ranched in partnership and purchased their Uncle David's ranch of about eight hundred acres adjoining the old home, operating both places. Four years later William bought John's interest in the two ranches, and since then has operated them alone.

For a while he ran both sheep and cattle, but later he sold the sheep and devoted his time to cattle growing. He at one time had sixteen hundred fifty acres, but sold off some, still owning, however, over twelve hundred acres. "Highland Acres," as the ranch is known, is well watered by Lawrence creek and Booth's run, as well as by numerous springs and creek. It is wooded with redwood, pine, oak and madrone—and makes a splendid cattle ranch. His brand is his father's old brand, O O. Of Highland Acres about three hundred acres can be cultivated, the balance being stock range. There are four different orchards on the place. In May, 1914, his residence was burned and he has since built a new one, a large two-storey bungalow, with basement. By his industry and energy Mr. Mullen has a well improved and valuable place, on which he can carry two hundred head of cattle.

Mr. Mullen was married in Eureka February 11, 1915, being united with Jennie Furman, a native of Tennessee. Fraternally he is a member of Fortuna Lodge No. 221, I.P.P.F., in Eureka.

For twelve years he served as road overseer in Supervisorial district No. 3, doing efficient and valuable work in his district. Politically he espouses the principles of the Republican party and is a man with a host of friends, who admire him for his uprightness, integrity and worth.





C27-Ruth Lynne Mullen—was born-19 February, 1921 in Sunnyside, Washington to John and Alma (Miller) Heimbigner and was married to William F. Mullen. She died 23 May, 1982 at Carson City, Nevada.

Her most recent position was as In Home Health Services Director of the Inter Tribal Council of Nevada. This was her most prized position as she was a great champion of the American Indian.

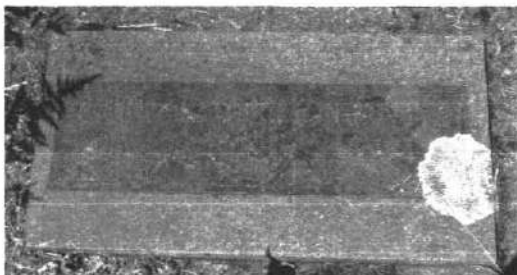

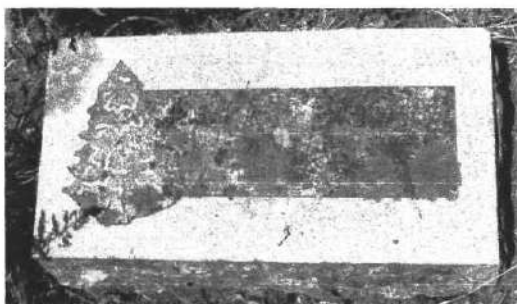

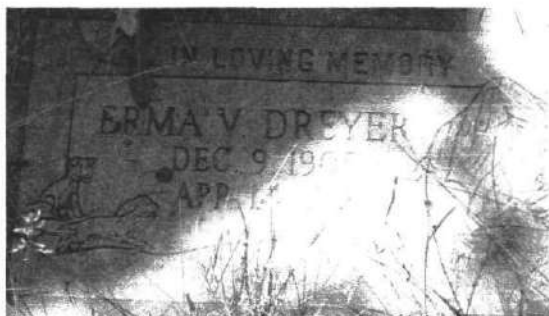

Her obituary in the *Times Standard* reads:

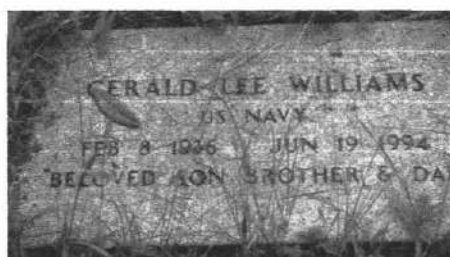

D1-Fronia "Fronie" Elton Shaw—was born near laqua on October 13, 1878 to Thomas Jacob and Mary Ann (McCord) Shaw. She died 18 September, 1883 at laqua.



D2-Thomas Jacob Shaw—was born 29 March, 1838 in Carroll County, Illinois to Thomas Jones and Elizabeth Ann (Brice) Shaw. He married Mary Ann McCord on 15 August, 1871 in Eureka, Humboldt County, California. He died 15 April, 1908.

His biography in "Coast Counties"⁶ reads:

"Thomas Jacob Shaw. A well-known and respected citizen of laqua, Thomas Jacob Shaw has for many years been actively identified with the industrial progress of this section of Humboldt County as one of its most successful agriculturists. A man of persistent industry and steadiness of purpose, he has well performed his part in developing

and improving Bucksport township, where he is an extensive land owner rendering its rich and fertile soil productive and enlarging its stock and dairy interests. A native of Carroll county, Ill., he was born March 29, 1838. His parents, T. Jones and Eliza M. (Brice) Shaw, were both born in Kentucky, but settled after their marriage in Illinois, from there removing to Iowa. In 1857 they removed with their family to Linn county, Kans., and took up land near Mound City, where they cleared and improve a homestead.

Going with his parent to Iowa when a boy of nine years, Thomas Jacob Shaw there received a common school education. From 1857 until 1859 he assisted his father in clearing a farm in Linn county, Kans. In the latter year, confident that more money could be made from the mineral resource of mother earth than from her vegetable production, he went by way of the Santa Fe trail to Denver and Colorado City and mined for one season, not meeting, however, with the anticipated results. With a party of young men he then started for the headwater of the Arkansas river, but being taken ill before reaching his point of destination he returned to the parental homestead in Kansas. In 1861, leaving home for the second time, he went to Iowa, where he spent a year. May 2, 1862, in an emigrant train composed of thirty wagons, Mr. Shaw began the tedious journey across the plains, traveling as far as Virginia City, Nev., where he left the company, and for five years thereafter was employed in teaming. Coming via Placerville, Linden and San Francisco to Humboldt county in 1867, Mr. Shaw located in Bucksport township.

⁶ **History of the State of California and biographical record of coast counties:** an historical story of the state's marvelous growth from its earliest settlement to the present time, James Miller Guinn, Chapman Publishing Company, 1904.

Taking up the land included in his home ranch the same year he soon erected a small cabin, and at once began the improvement of a homestead. By diligence, thrift and good management he overcame the many difficulties that beset his pathway, and in the course of time added to his original purchase, having now five hundred and eighty acres in his home ranch, and one thousand and two acres of valuable land on Mad river. On his homestead, which is located thirty-seven miles from Eureka, he keeps about two hundred head of cattle, making stock-raising and dairying his principal industries, the farm being largely managed by his son Thomas. The original cabin has been replaced by a commodious modern dwelling house, built in 1884, and, with its surroundings gives evidence of the enterprise and prosperity of the owner.

August 15, 1871, in Eureka, Cal., Mr. Shaw married Mary Ann McCord who was born in New York state, and they became the parents of the following children: Ramona, born August 3, 1874; George W., born April 24, 1876; Fronia E., born October 13, 1878; Thomas J., born September 24, 1881; Anita Isabel, born January 19, 1884; Estella M., born November 30, 1886; Flora A., born August 31, 1888; Lewis M., born February 9, 1891; Anna C., born December 9, 1893; Helen E., born January 9, 1898; and Marion B., born March 12, 1900. The three elder sons are farmsteaders and are prosperously engaged in general farming and stock-raising. Politically Mr. Shaw is a time honored Democrat and rendered good service to the township as a member of the school board, a position that he has filled many years. Fraternally he is a member of the Woodmen of the World."

An obituary for Mr. Shaw appeared in the *Daily Times* of 19 April, 1908. It reads:

"Another Pioneer Passes On

T.J. Shaw, Resident in Humboldt County for Forty Years, Goes to Join the Great, Silent Majority.

T.J. Shaw of Kneeland, formerly of Iaqua, died there Wednesday morning at 10 o'clock after a lingering illness, and was buried at Iaqua, Friday afternoon at 2 o'clock, the Rev. R. D. Clark of this city performing the funeral service.

Mr. Shaw was 70 years old March 19th and had lived in Humboldt since 1873[Guinn states that he was here in 1867]. He was a native of Illinois. In 1861 he crossed the plains to Virginia City in Nevada, where he mined for seven years.

Until last year Mr. Shaw had ranched at Iaqua, but since then he had been residing at Kneeland, have turned his ranch over to one of his sons.

Mrs. Shaw was one of the best known and most respected residents of Humboldt County. There are left a widow, Mrs. Anna Shaw, and ten children: Mrs. J.C. Walling of Coos County, Oregon; Misses Stella Shaw, Flora Shaw, Annie C. Shaw, Elizabeth Shaw, and Marian Shaw, all of Kneeland; R.S. Shaw, Geo. W. Shaw and Louis S. Shaw of Kneeland and Thos. J. Shaw Jr. of Iaqua.

The deceased also leaves two brothers and five sisters. The sisters are: Mrs. J.D.H. Chamberlain of Eureka; Mrs. H. Lambert of Eureka, Miss Sophrania Shaw of Eureka; Mrs. John Ogden of Oakland; and Mrs. John Condon of Center Point, Iowa. The brothers are Frank Shaw of Eureka and J.S. Shaw of Oakland. The late John D. Shaw of Elk River and former Assessor George Shaw were also brothers."





D3-Mary Ann (McCord) Shaw—was born 18 January, 1854 in Staten Island, New York to James and Ann McCord both of Ireland. She married Thomas Jacob Shaw on 15 August, 1871 in Eureka and died 29 March, 1933 at Freshwater of heart failure.

This notice appeared in the *Humboldt Standard* of 31 March, 1933:

"SHAW—In this city on Wednesday March 29th, 1933, Mrs. Mary Shaw, widow of the late Thomas J. Shaw, loving mother of Rienza S. Shaw, Hydesville, Thomas J. Shaw, Iaqua, Lewis M. Shaw, Lone Star, Estella M. Severns, Freshwater, Dixie A. Horrell, Eureka, Marion B.

"Mrs. Dixie A. Horrell Dies

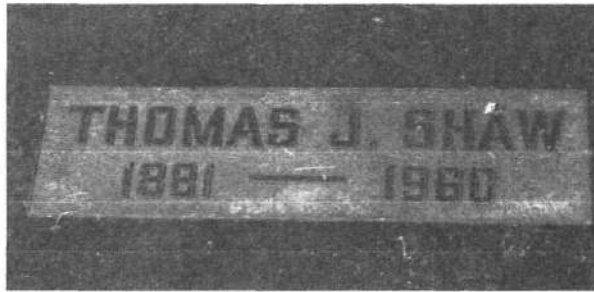

He was born on the ranch in a log cabin that his parents built when they homesteaded the ranch in 1875. Shaw operated the ranch most of his life.

He was a member of the Cattlemen's Association, Farm Bureau and Humboldt County Pioneers.

He is survived by two children, Mrs. Ruth Gift McBride of Kneeland and Mrs. Anita Goldschmidt of Fort Seward; a brother, L.M. Shaw of Kneeland; sisters Mrs. Estella Severns of Yreka, Mrs. Flora Baker of Kneeland and Mrs. Elizabeth Horrell of Eureka and several nieces and nephews.

Funeral services will be held at the Pierce Mortuary ... with the Rev. James P. Scuter officiating. Concluding services will be held in the laqua cemetery.

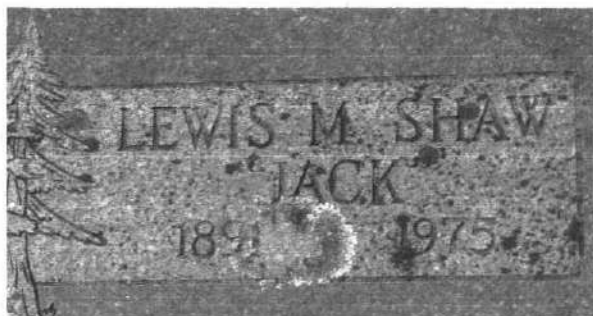

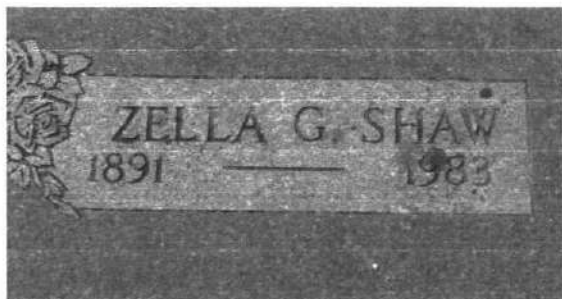
His obituary in the *Times Standard* of 7 April, 1975 reads:

"Shaw, Zella G., died in Fortuna 30 April, 1983 at age 91. A native of Bald Mountain, she was a resident of Kneeland.

Mrs. Shaw was a member of the Humboldt Historical Society and Humboldt County Farm Bureau. She was a former member of the Rebekah Lodge, the Humboldt County Cow Belles and the Wool Growers Association. She and her two brothers are the last members of the pioneer Graham family, of which there were originally 12 children. She graduated from Arcata High School and 70 years ago graduated from San Jose Normal School. She taught at Bald Mountain School, going to teach each day in a horse and buggy. She and her late husband Louis M. (Jack) Shaw operated their ranch at Kneeland since 1917. For the past 20 months she has been at St. Luke Manor in Fortuna.

She is survived by her son and daughter-in-law, Clifford and Marianna Shaw of Tacoma, Wash., her daughter and son-in-law, Eleanor and Clarence Edsall of Kneeland; her brother Fred Graham of Blue Lake, and George Graham of Eureka; her sister-in-law Elizabeth Horrell; her grandchildren, Steve Shaw, Suzanne Bohleen, Christine Bird, Michael Edsall, and Don and David

Shaw; eight great grandchildren; and numerous nieces and nephews. She was preceded in death by her husband, Louis M. (Jack) Shaw."



D9- Cornelia (Glendy) Harrison—was born 5 September, 1864 in Vinton, Benton County, Iowa to John Edgar and Elizabeth Ann (Speer/Spear) Glendy. She married James R. Harrison on 10 August, 1881 in Vinton, Benton County, Iowa. She died of pneumonia on 13 December, 1910 at the Lone Star Ranch.

Her obituary in the *Daily Standard* of 3 September, 1910 reads:

"Mrs. Cornelia Harrison, wife of Jas. R. Harrison and mother of Carl Harrison, who passed away at her home at Lone Star, Monday night, was laid to rest at the laqua cemetery, December 15, Rev. R.D. Clark officiating. The services were held at the laqua cemetery and music was furnished by Mrs. Emma McBeth, Mrs. Della Gift and Miss Eda Clyde. The pall bearers were Messrs W. H. Mullen, W.D. Titus, Smith Sargent, T. Fredrickson, W.H. Fredrickson and George Shaw."



D10-James R. Harrison—was born 25 March, 1858 in Benton, Iowa to James and Rhoda Caroline (Floyd) Harrison. He married Cornelia Glendy on 10 August, 1881 in Vinton, Benton County, Iowa. He died 2 July, 1926 in Los Angeles, California.

His death notice in the *Humboldt Standard* of 9 July, 1926 reads:

"Harrison—In Los Angeles, Calif. on July 2, 1926, James R. Harrison, beloved father of C.C. Harrison of Los Angeles, Calif., a native of Iowa, aged 68 years, 3 months, and 7 days. Friends and acquaintances are respectfully invited to attend the funeral ... at the Cemetery in laqua, Calif. Rev. George C. Pearson of the Methodist Church officiating. Interment at laqua Cemetery."

Another article appeared the same day:

"Funeral of James Harrison Will Be Held On Sunday

The body of James R. Harrison, a former resident of this county, who died at Los Angeles arrived on the train this morning and was taken to the Sanders parlors. Deceased, who was an old time rancher of the laqua section, was a native of Iowa, aged about 68 years. He leaves an only son, C.C. Harrison of Los Angeles. From here the body will be taken to laqua, where services will be conducted by the Rev. George C. Pearson of this city, Sunday afternoon. Interment will be at the laqua cemetery."





D11-Carl C. Harrison—was born 20 July, 1882 in Iowa to James R. and Cornelia (Glendy) Harrison. He died 9 January, 1958 in Stockton, San Joaquin County, California.

His obituary in the Eureka *Humboldt Standard* of 11 January, 1958 reads:

"Carl C. Harrison, son of the late Mr. and Mrs. James R. Harrison of Kneeland, died Thursday in Stockton after a lingering illness. He was 75, and a native of Iowa, who had lived in the Kneeland area for many years before moving to Stockton. He is survived by two cousins, Ross Harrison of Stockton, and E. M. Glendy of Santa Rosa.

Graveside services will be held ... in Iaqua Cemetery under the direction of Martin Funeral Home, Stockton."



D12-Florence L. (Pennell) Sibley—was born 2 May, 1884 in DeWitt, Clinton County, Michigan to Mark and Ellen G. (Nothan/Northan) Pennell. She married Luther W. Sibley on 20 September, 1905 in Dewitt, Clinton County, Michigan. She died 2 September, 1910 at Iaqua of tubercular meningitis.

This brief obituary appeared the *Daily Standard* 3 September, 1910:

"Mrs. Florence Sibley of Iaqua, died at her home there yesterday morning after a lingering illness and will be buried in Iaqua cemetery Deceased was a native of Michigan, aged 26 years and leaves besides her husband, L.W. Sibley, a well known rancher of that section, one child, Willard Sibley."



D13-Luther Willard Sibley—was born 27 April, 1875 to Levi W. and Alzina (Carr) Sibley in DeWitt, Clinton County, Michigan. He married Florence L. Pennell on 20 September, 1905 in DeWitt, Clinton County, Michigan. He married Alice after Florence died. Luther died 6 October, 1959 in Eureka, Humboldt County, California.

His biography in the "History of Humboldt County" reads"

"Luther Willard Sibley.—A prominent and enterprising rancher and the present postmaster at Iaqua, Luther W. Sibley is a native of Michigan, born near Dewitt, Clinton county, April 27, 1875, the son of Levi W. and Alzina (Carr) Sibley, natives of Plattsburg, N.Y. The father served in the Civil war as a member of Company A, Ninety-sixth New York Volunteer Infantry, and was seriously wounded at the Battle of Gettysburg, and was also wounded in another battle. After a service of three years and eleven months he was honorably discharged, after which he came to Michigan, where, in Ingham county, he was married to Alzina Carr, the Carr family being very old

settlers of the county. He became a well-to-do farmer and with his wife resided on his place near Dewitt.

Of their seven children Luther, the third oldest, received his education in the public schools and the Lansing high school, after which he entered the Michigan Agricultural College at Lansing, where he completed a special course. He then engaged in the creamery business, operating a creamery at Dewitt for ten and one-half years. In the meantime he started a lumber yard which he conducted the last five years of his residence in Michigan.

In 1906 Mr. Sibley made his first trip to the Pacific coast, and from Portland, Ore., came to Humboldt county. He liked the country, and after making three trips within a year concluded to locate here, a change which he hoped would benefit his wife's health. Disposing of his interests in Michigan he located here permanently in 1907. Purchasing the old Frame ranch of eleven hundred forty acres at Iaqua, twenty eight miles east of Eureka, he has since followed farming and stock raising, meeting with good success. He raises an abundance of hay and grain and operates a thresher run by a gas engine, threshing not only his own grain, but that of others as well. He also specialized in dairying, milking about twenty-five cows. The ranch is located on Booths run and is also well watered by other streams and springs and is well wooded with fir and tan oak, about one hundred fifty acres of the ranch being under cultivation. Aside from the ranch he also owns some redwood and fir timber. In 1909 he secured the reestablishment of the postoffice at Iaqua and was appointed postmaster, and has had the postoffice at his place ever since.

In Dewitt, Mich., occurred the marriage of Mr. Sibley and Florence Pennell, a native of that place. She died here in 1910, leaving one child, Luther Willard, Jr. Mr. Sibley was school trustee of Iaqua district one term and was also clerk of the board. Fraternally he is a Mason, being a member of Dewitt Lodge in his place in Michigan, while politically he is a Progressive."

These brief mentions appeared in the *Eureka Humboldt Standard* of 6 and 8 October, 1959:

"Luther W. Sibley, 85, died early this morning in a local hospital. He was born 27 April, 1874, in DeWitt, Michigan, and had resided in this area since 1907. He was a charter member of Freshwater Grange.

Survivors include his wife, Mrs. Alice Sibley; son, L. Willard Sibley, Kneeland; brother, Alger Sibley, DeWitt, Michigan and several nieces and nephews.

Funeral arrangements are pending under the direction of the Pierce Mortuary."

"Funeral services for Luther W. Sibley will be conducted ... from the Pierce Mortuary. The Rev. George H. Warman will officiate.

Active pallbearers will be the Henri Rousseau, Gael Gregory, Lester Gregory, Cornell Paddock and Sterling Paddock."

This notice appeared in the *Humboldt Standard* on 21 April, 1948:

This short article appeared in the *Humboldt Standard* 21 December, 1928:

"Everett Ellingwood Dies At Hospital"

Everett Ellingwood, 51, died at a local hospital last night. Ellingwood is quite widely known here and was formerly in the employ of the Little River Redwood Company. As a result of injuries he received at work about a year ago he had been receiving treatment for several months.

The deceased is survived by a stepfather, two half brothers, two sons and a daughter. The body is at the Cooper Funeral Parlors pending funeral arrangements."



D33-Smith Henry Sargent—was born 6 June, 1860 in Canterbury, New Hampshire to Moses and Fanny P. (Glines) Sargent. He married Adell P. Ellingwood on 31 July, 1883 in Milan, Coos County, New Hampshire. He died 1 December, 1938 at his home in Eureka, California.

This article appeared in *Humboldt Standard* December 1, 1938:

"Smith Sargent Succumbs Here"

Smith Henry Sargent, 78 years old, died this morning at his home, 2303 Summer street, Eureka. He was born in Maine [New

Hampshire], had lived in Humboldt county 46 years and was formerly employed as a woodsman. Surviving are two sons, Murray and Chester Sargent of Eureka and several grandchildren.

Funeral services will be held ... in Black's funeral parlor in Arcata with Rev. C.P. Hessel officiating. Burial will be in the laqua cemetery."



D34-Adell Philomelia (Ellingwood) Sargent—was born 12 February, 1855 in Milan, Coos County, New Hampshire to John Wesley and Mariah K. (Flint) Ellingwood. She married Smith H. Sargent on 31 July, 1883 in Milan, Coos County, New Hampshire. She died 24 May, 1907 as the result of shooting herself in a suicide attempt the week earlier.

This article regarding her suicide attempt appeared in the *Daily Times* of 18 May 1907:

"Tries To End Life With Gun

An attempt to commit suicide by shooting herself was made by a Mrs. Sargeant (sic) at her home in Dogtown, a mile and a half beyond laqua, last Wednesday morning between 9 and 10 o'clock. The woman has been suffering for the last four years with lingering illness. After medical assistance had reached her she still expressed her desire to die and end her misery. She had been confined to her bed since

last September. Drs. F.H. Otmer and I. Wing of this city were summoned shortly after the occurrence and arrived at the home Thursday morning after a long and hard drive. They found this woman's clothing burned quite distinctively around a bullet hole that had been made in the left breast. Fortunately the bullet from a 44 caliber pistol was deflected by a rib which it followed all the way round to a point in the back near the spinal column merely making a flesh wound. All the surgeons had to do was to make a small slit to extract the lead, which was the same as when it left the weapon, not having been flattened.

It seems that her husband had only a short time previously to the shooting left the house to procure a little tobacco. When he returned it was to find his wife on the bed with the pistol nearby. Dr. Wing will leave this morning to visit the patient. Mr. and Mrs. Sargent are said to have formerly lived at Wrangletown. The husband moved into the hills the benefit of his wife's health. "

The article regarding her death appeared in the *Daily Times* on 25 May, 1907 reads:

"Wanted to Die; Passes Away

Mrs. A.P. Sargent of Lone Star near laqua, who attempted suicide by shooting herself a week ago, passed away yesterday morning at 8:30 o'clock. Her son came from the home about 9 o'clock last night to make arrangements for the funeral having ridden horse back all of the distance, 40 miles, starting out at 3 o'clock in the afternoon.

The son, Everett Ellingwood, says that the wound where the bullet was extracted from his mother's back began to bleed a short time before her death. Whether this was the direct cause of the demise is not known. It is probable that it only hastened the passing. The deceased was afflicted with nervous trouble.

Mrs. Sargent, Mr. Ellingwood says, had been an invalid for 15 or 20 years, but had not been confined to her bed until last September since when she had been compelled to lie quiet. Mr. Ellingwood was at his ranch at Fort Baker, when the shooting occurred. On reaching his mother's side she told him she was weary of life, and wanted to die before the doctor arrived.

Five years ago Mr. and Mrs. Sargent were residents of Wrangletown. The home at Lone Star is a homestead.

The deceased leaves six children—four sons and two daughters—Everett Ellingwood of Fort Baker, Chester Sargent of Hydesville, Murray Sargent of Lone Star, and one son and two daughters in New Hampshire. Beside the husband there is a sister, Mrs. Al. Reed, residing in northwestern Mendocino county and four cousins—Mrs. Will Timmons of this city, Mrs. Hugh Smith and Mrs. Frank McLauchlan of Ferndale, and Frank Flint of the Buhne ranch.

Robert E. McKenzie died at home September 23, 2007, after a long battle with cancer. He was born June 17,

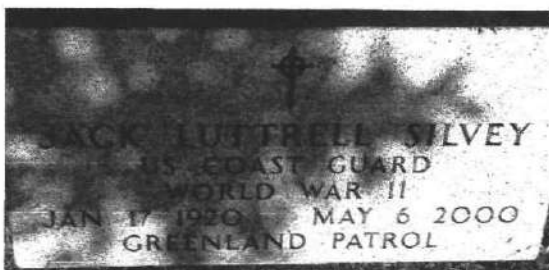

As word reached the Bay Area of the death of former Palo Alto Times news editor Jack Luttrell Silvey, those who remembered him, to a person, spoke of his kindness.

"Jack was a gentleman and he was kind," said his close friend and former Los Altos neighbor Claude Everson, a retired Lockheed employee. "He never wanted things with a flash. He was very patient, very thorough, loved to garden and he never met a stranger." Mr. Silvey, 80, died of a stroke May 6. It occurred near Santa Rosa while he and his wife, Pat, were driving from the San Francisco Airport to their home in McKinleyville.

According to a witness who assisted the couple, the car veered across the road about six miles north of Laytonville, became airborne and flipped end over end several times.

He was airlifted to the Santa Rosa Memorial Hospital where he died. Pat Silvey received cuts on her head, an injured arm and some fractured vertebrae but has been released from the hospital.

Mr. Silvey was born in British Columbia, Canada, grew up in Felton and served in the Coast Guard on North Atlantic convoy duty during World War II.

He was an honors graduate in journalism at San Jose State University and, after working at the Los Gatos Times Observer, joined the Palo Alto Times.

"I promoted Jack to news editor," said Alexander S. Bodi, editor of the Palo Alto Times from 1953 until 1978.

"He became the news editor in 1954," said Bodi, now retired and living in Salt Lake City. "He was a very conscientious man — someone you could always count on," said Bodi. "Some people are always steady and you can depend on them to do the right thing, and that was Jack Silvey in my mind."

Silvey also served as assistant managing editor of the Peninsula Times Tribune, which succeeded the Palo Alto Times.

"I spent some time on the (copy) desk," said Jay Thorwaldson, who was a reporter and ombudsman at the two papers before leaving to become director of public affairs at the Palo Alto Medical Foundation.

"Jack was such a kind person and a fine journalist. He cared that the headline reflected what the story said," said Thorwaldson, who becomes editor of the Palo Alto Weekly on June 5.

Ward Winslow, of Palo Alto, a journalist and author who worked with Silvey at both papers, was managing editor of the Palo Alto Times.

"Jack was a wonderful guy to work with and had a very even-tempered disposition," said Winslow. "He was steady, and he got moving toward the objectives and getting the stories that were picked for Page 1."

"He lived a great life and he loved being a journalist," said Silvey's daughter, Gail Kallas of Milwaukee, Wis., who is a doctor of internal medicine. "His family came first over anything — that's the way Dad was."

The Silveys were active at the Los Altos Union Presbyterian church, where they were both elders, neighbor Everson said. At the time of his death, he served as an elder and deacon at the First Presbyterian Church of Eureka.

The Silveys would have been married 55 years in October.



E6-Olive "Patricia" (Carr) Silvey—was born 5 December, 1925 in New York to Edward H. and Olive H. Carr. She married Jack L. Silvey in New York in 1945. She died 17 July, 2001.

Her obituary in the *Times Standard* of 22 July, 2001 reads:

"Patricia C. Silvey, the beloved wife of the late Jack Luttrell Silvey and beloved mother, grandmother and sister, passed away at home on July 17, 2001, at the age of 75. She fought a courageous battle with cancer for two and one half years.
