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A Short History of Blue Lake Cemetery

A walk through the older section of Blue Lake Cemetery is a review of the history of the Town of Blue Lake itself. There are buried its founding fathers, business men—and women, the people who were the backbone of its society. They came from all over the world to live there and chose Blue Lake Cemetery as their final resting place.

About 1892, the people of the Town of Blue Lake began to consider establishing a cemetery. It is not clear if the reason was that they wanted to have a cemetery of their own, or because Almonzo Norton did not want any more people buried on his land in Scottsville. What we do know is that in the early part of January, 1892 the Blue Lake Cemetery Association was incorporated with Almonzo Norton, Clement Chartin, K. Geer, Samuel Baxter and Dr. Marvin as directors. The Blue Lake Advocate reported this event on January 16, 1892; writing:

"Preliminary work of clearing up the ground and subdividing it into burial lots is to be begun immediately and the new cemetery is expected to be ready for use within two weeks from this time. The location is admirable, being high and dry and convenient to town."

Perhaps two weeks may have been too ambitious of a timetable, for Gus Perigot in the acerbic style he was known for, reports in the Blue Lake Advocate on March 12, 1892:

"The "Advocate" has had a good deal to say about the new cemetery (to be) and has observed closely the successive steps for the conversion of a tract of ground profusely accentuated with stumps into a beautiful city of the dead. This is so because until arrival of the ecstatic period when it will be "good form" to have ourselves cremated, burial grounds will continue to be necessary.

The work of improvement has been unduly retarded by lack of blasting material and for a time it looked as if San Francisco had a corner on explosive good and meant to keep it.

But a new supply was finally obtained and the cemetery ground the first of the week was strewn with stumps (and fragments of stumps) of all descriptions. The last one, a twelve footer, was ousted Wednesday and when it rose into the air in response to the moral suasion of a few pounds of dynamite it left a hole in Mother Earth big enough to bury a horse and wagon.

After the grounds shall be cleared of debris they will be laid off into plats and walks and beautified by shade trees and flowers."

On November 11th, 1892 the final transfer of land between Clement Chartin and the Blue Lake Cemetery Association took place. We do not know what the lots sold for originally, but from a deed dated August of 1904, we know that the lots sold for \$10.00 at that time.

The beautification of the cemetery would be a constant struggle from the beginning. As early as the 10th of October, 1896, the Blue Lake Advocate reports:

"Lately a lot of pigs have been seen in the Blue Lake Cemetery, tramping over the graves and digging under several of them. This ought not to be permitted. The owners of the cemetery and pigs should make arrangements and fix its fences between their lands. With a good fence the

pigs could not come in and Blue Lake would then be proud to let the world know that we have a well-kept graveyard."

On February 25, 1911 the Blue Lake Cemetery Association authorized J.E. Merriam to purchase an additional 3 ½ acres from Sherman Norton to expand the cemetery. Expansion of the cemetery also meant more up-keep and the fact that Blue Lake Cemetery is a non-endowment cemetery; meaning no monies has been aside by the purchasers of the lots for maintenance, it is up to each individual owner to weed and clear their plots. Obviously this is difficult for out-of-town relatives or those inhabitants of the cemetery with no family. As the Advocate reported on May 27, 1922:

"The improvement work in the Blue Lake Cemetery, which was started several weeks ago, is about completed. Besides the installation of the city water on the grounds, a new driveway has been made, alleys have been cleared and graded, a new wire fence has been erected in front and altogether the cemetery grounds have been transformed from what appeared a wilderness to a new and neat appearing place. The committee in charge of the work deserves great credit for the wonderful showing of improvements made with such a small sum of money at hand.

This goes to show what concerted action and co-operation will do in any community. Last fall a subscription paper was circulated by Miss Berthe Perigot and J.E. Merriam among the lot owners to raise funds for the installation of city water thereon, and out of that fund and through the donation of work by several of our people, notably John Cabanot, the right bower of the committee in charge of the work, the additional improvements were effected.

It is to be hoped that all lot owners in the cemetery will take more interest and provide some ways and means to keep up the good work now so well started."

For many years Revis Courtwright, descendant of Lancaster Lupton, maintained the cemetery, living there in a trailer. In 1968, Ocean View-Sunset Memorial Association, located in Eureka, purchased the cemetery with the purpose of keeping up the maintenance after the cemetery had begun to become overgrown again. Unfortunately, a struggle it will always be, for Blue Lake cemetery is over a century old and such is the intent of Mother Nature to reclaim her land. Let us hope that this never happens as Blue Lake Cemetery is rich in history!

County of Humboldt, State of California, and bounded and particularly described as follows, to-wit: Lot number (2) two in Block number (4) four in the Blue Lake Cemetery, as the map or Plat shows that is on file in the Office of the County Recorder of said Humboldt-County, Cal.

Together with all and singular the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances thereunto belonging, or in anywise appertaining, and the reversion and reversions, remainder and remainders, rents, issues and profits thereof.

To have and to hold, all and singular, the said premises, together with the appurtenances, unto the said party of the second part, and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In Witness Whereof, the said party of the first part has hereunto set his hand - and seal - the day and year first above written.

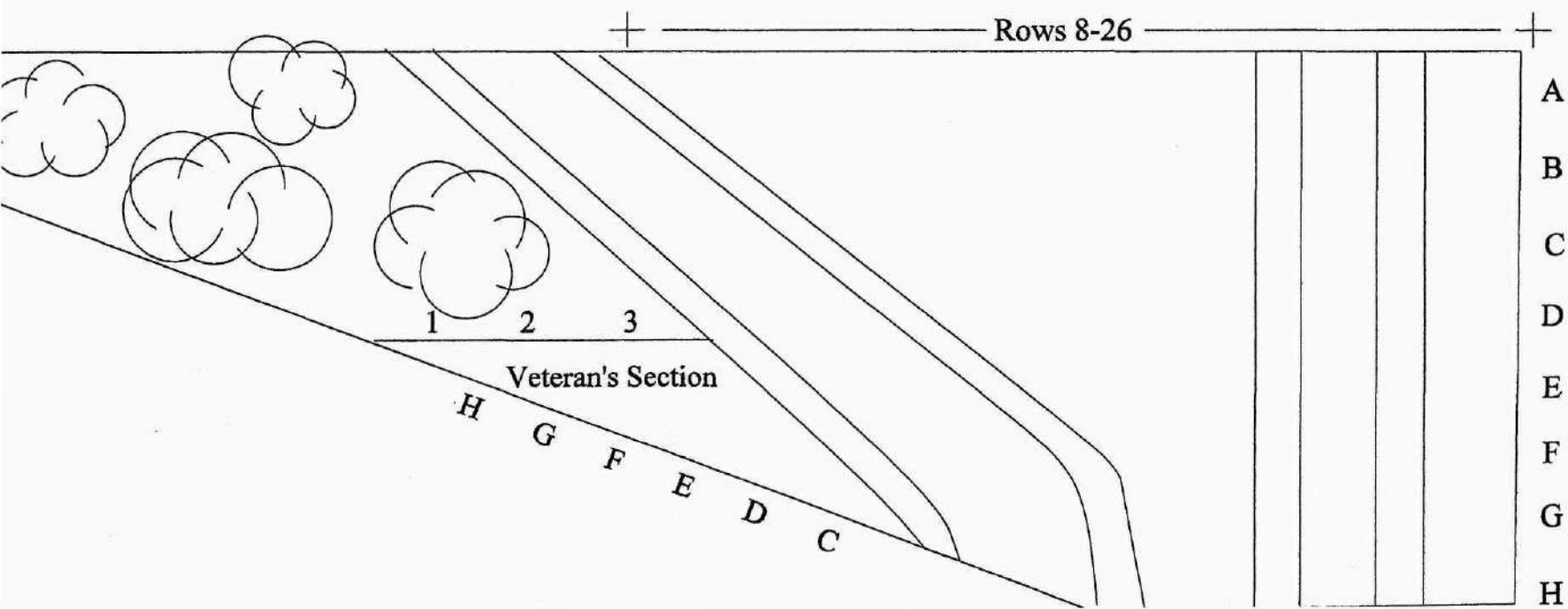
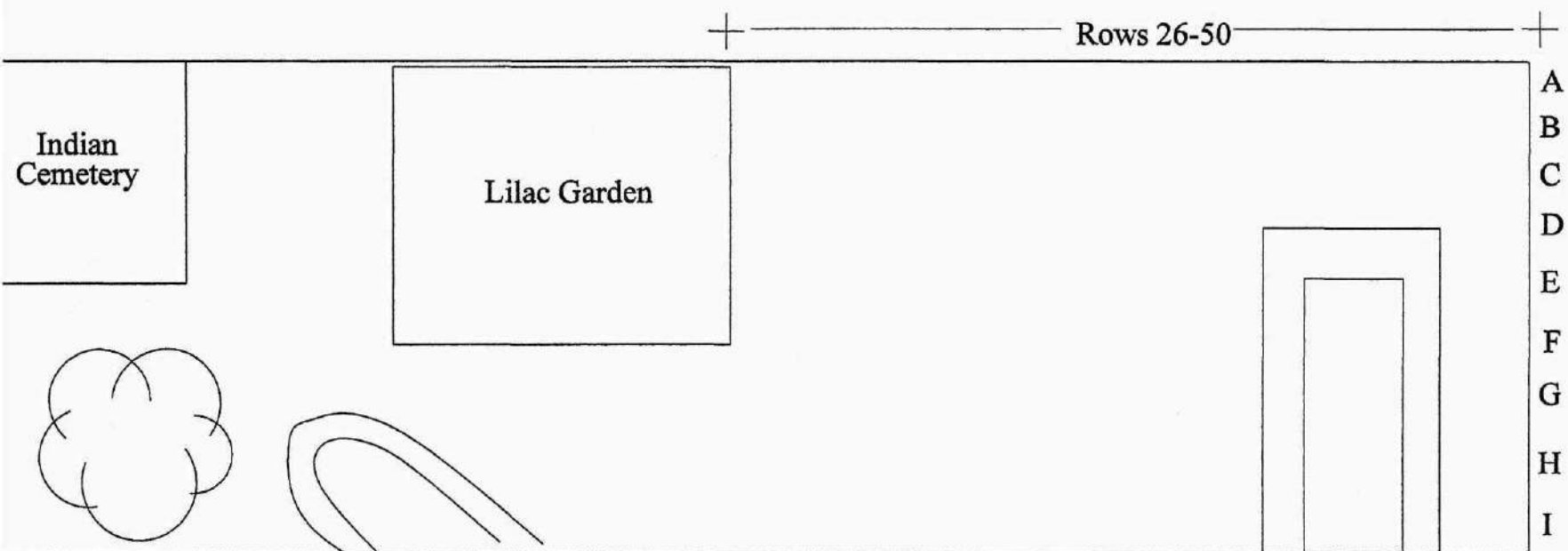

Blue Lake Cemetery

The compilation of the Blue Lake Cemetery records was natural follow-up of previous research for the Scottsville Cemetery. In an effort to compile a list of names of people that might possibly be buried in the unmarked section of Scottsville Cemetery, it was necessary to compile a list of people that were buried at Blue Lake Cemetery.

My thanks to the many people who helped me in this endeavor: Peace Gardner, for her research in 1992; Marilyn Milota, for her invaluable compilation of Humboldt County death records and obituaries which filled in names for initials, provided more accurate death dates, places of birth and sometimes causes of death; Janice Bertolini, for her biographies, being my sounding board, proof reader and more; Jean Leavitt for her biography, an index for some of the gravesites and previous research on the French immigrants of Blue Lake; Liz Jackson and Paul Angell of the Blue Lake Tribal office for their help with names for the unmarked graves in the Indian Section of the cemetery and Don McCombs of Ocean View –Sunset Memorial Assoc.

As in any compilation of a record of events that have taken place for over a century there will be errors. I apologize for any that may occur, but I have made every effort to do a complete and as thorough a job as possible.

Since the Blue Lake Cemetery is much larger, it was impossible to do an as complete of a research as we did for Scottsville, so we selected what we hope is a representation of the people buried there to write biographies about.

Following each entry is an abbreviation for the source for the record. Here is a key to those resources:

35-C	SDBHum.	William McDowell Baesler and his wife, Louise, now lie side by side in the Blue Lake Cemetery after having served the Presbyterian Church here for 21 years; from 1893 to 1914. Rev. Baesler and Louise Brinkman were married just two weeks after his ordination by Monmouth Presbytery, New Jersey, on October 4, 1882. After several pastorates in New Jersey and California, he was called to Blue Lake, arriving on January 31, 1893. His work was cut out for him. The logging community took its Sundays lightly, drinking, gambling and enjoying boxing matches and horse races. So he took his ministry into the logging camps. With him he carried gifts of pictures and articles and the Gospel of St. John in English, Italian and Finnish languages and he sang to the men after supper and gave a little talk. Rev. Baesler organized a congregation in Bayside; their building was dedicated in 1899. A century later, both of his churches survive. He belonged to the Knights of Pythias and he served as the first City Clerk of Blue Lake. He conducted many burials in the Blue Lake Cemetery. Mrs. Baesler was just as busy as her husband. She was Superintendent of the Primary Department of the Sunday school and an active member of the Ladies Aid Society. The girls in her Willing Workers group learned sewing and fine embroidery. In 1914, Rev. Baesler was given charge of the Hoopa Mission. He retired in ill health to his home in Blue Lake in late 1918 and died in early 1919. Louise joined him in death in 1955--<i>J. Leavitt</i>

	ADR	"Oh, what a tangled web we weave..." is a time-worn adage, but nothing is more apropos in describing genealogy, especially the family tree of Clement Chartin, founder of the town of Blue Lake, California. Clement Chartin came to Humboldt County in 1871. After a brief stay in Arcata with Alexander Brizard, a long time friend from his native country of France, he purchased 160 acres from William Green in the Mad River Valley. His land included a small lake by which he envisioned a resort with a hotel that would service the not only the travelers on the trail to and from the Hoopa Valley and Bald Mountain, but would also attract vacationers with its picturesque setting. Chartin built his hotel. He also built a livery stable, a dance platform by the lake, a general store and a hall. He did build a home for his family too, dubbed the "White House" because it was the only home in town with a coat of white paint, where he and his wife, Antoinette Deschartes Chartin, and her sister, Clemence Deschartes, lived. In 1888 Chartin was granted the right to establish a Post Office. Chartin also began the newspaper, the "Northern Advocate." His sister-in-law, Clemence, also had her own business, the Blue Lake Drug Store, which she later, unfortunately, lost in a fire. The post office and the railroad that came through town would give precedence for the Town of Blue Lake over its neighbor, Scottsville; which later became absorbed into Blue Lake. In 1889 Chartin returned to France with his wife and sister-in-law. There he recruited his brothers, Albert and Alexis and his sister Marie to return to Blue Lake with him. Clement, Antoinette and Albert Chartin arrived in New York in November of 1889 with his sister, Marie, and her husband, Joseph Vaslin, with their sons, Valentin, Clement and Joseph Jr. and their daughter, Mrs. Clementine Vaslin Perigot. Mrs. Perigot, in turn brought her children, Gus, Berthe, and Amelia. The group traveling from France to New York also included Alphonse Gibouret; his wife, Adelinde Daligny Gibouret, and son, Emile, and his in-laws, Leon and Louise F. Daligny. Desiré Peron and his wife Eugenie Daligny Peron and their son Jules, followed the Chartins to the United States in July of 1890. Two daughters, Lena and Laura were born to Desiré and Eugenie Peron after they came to Blue Lake. Mr. Peron became Blue Lake's barber after an accident in a mill. Their daughter, Laura, died at the age of 10 in 1909 of spinal meningitis. Desiré, Eugenie and Laura are all buried at Blue Lake Cemetery. Chartin's youngest brother, Alexis Chartin, arrived in the United States September of 1890 bringing his wife, Clemence, and daughter, Mathilde, along with Henri Rousseau and his wife, Julia, and son, Robert. Clement Chartin died in 1898 of tuberculosis; Clemence Deschartes in November of 1914, while her sister, Antoinette Chartin, followed soon after in April of 1915. Joseph Vaslin died in 1897 and his wife Marie Chartin Vaslin died in 1908. Clement and Joseph Vaslin, Jr., must have returned to France. Their son Valentin married Elisa Gely, sister of Louis and Marie Gely. Louis had a tailor shop; was the Wells Fargo agent and also built a lodging house and several cottages which he rented out.

44-A	PG	Gustave Perigot, better known as "Gus," went on to become the editor of his uncle's newspaper, now known as the "Blue Lake Advocate." After his death in 1929 his sister, Berthe, took over the editorship of the paper. She and her nephew, Pierre, who was visiting from France, were killed in an auto accident in 1955. It was decided that Pierre's body would not be returned to France and he is buried with the Perigots. Alexis, who listed himself as a "capitalist," died in 1901; his wife, Clemence, in 1914. His daughter, Mathilde, married Phillipe Loupiac, son of Arthenon and Marie Loupiac, also emigrants from France and residents of Blue Lake. The Chartin, Vaslin and Perigot families are all buried in the same fenced area in Blue Lake cemetery, known as the "French section;" though Phillipe and Mathilde Chartin Loupiac are just outside that fenced area. The rest of the Loupiac and Gely families are also buried in Blue Lake Cemetery. I wonder if the townspeople of Blue Lake were ever able to follow the complicated family tree of Clement Chartin?--K. Hendricks Another resident who was intimately involved in the activities of the Town of Blue Lake and its residents was Charles Crowden. Charley, as he was always called, was born July 4, 1869, in Eureka, to John George Crowden, an immigrant from England and his wife, Hannah Sigler Crowden. John Crowden had served as a sergeant in the Washington and Oregon Volunteer Infantry during the Civil War, before coming to Eureka in 1866. The Crowdens resided in Eureka for fifteen years, where John was a wagon maker and a charter member of Fire Engine Company Number 1. They then moved to Arcata where John worked as a millwright. In 1900, Charley married Lotta B. "Lottie" Merryman of West End (near Blue Lake.) They were attended by Charley's brother, Edward, and Lottie's sister, Grace; two years later Ed and Grace would marry each other. Charley and Lottie made their first home in Arcata. At the time of his marriage, Charley worked as a stationary engineer for the Arcata and Mad River Railroad. He was promoted to brakeman and later to conductor on the passenger train, where he served for many years. This was at the time when the high school students rode the train to and from school in Arcata. In 1904, Charley and Lottie purchased two lots in Blue Lake on Greenwood Avenue, where they built a home. Ed and Grace Crowden later built nearby on the same street. After moving to Blue Lake, Charley often rode to Korbel by bicycle, but in 1908, he purchased a "Rabbit" runabout and enjoyed the reputation of being a fine chauffeur. In Blue Lake he also became active in the Knights of Pythias, while Lottie joined the Pythian Sisters. He was also a member of Woodmen of the World where Charley played the trombone in the newly formed lodge band. Not content to limit his fraternal memberships, Charley served as the first president of the Fraternal Brotherhood Lodge, created exclusively in California. Even though it was called a "brotherhood," the organization was apparently not limited to men, as the first Secretary was Emma McPherson, wife of liveryman, J.A. McPherson and Elsie Merriam, daughter of Joseph Merriam, Justice of the Peace, would serve as financial secretary.

12-B	PG	Following the disastrous fire in December of 1911, Charlie became involved in Blue Lake Volunteer Fire Department's formation on December 30th of that year. He was the Department's first fire chief and served in that capacity for 12 years. In 1927 he was again elected to that position and served another four years, and was instrumental in obtaining a motor truck to replace the hand-drawn hose carts. Charley also served for a time as a deputy sheriff and was constable for Mad River Township. He also served several terms as a member of the city council. In August of 1913, Charley gained notoriety when nine Japanese men landed their sloop at Samoa and were making their way to the mountains. The Blue Lake Advocate reported: "Charley captained a small party who ran down part of the crew of a Japanese junk who, landing on our shores without warning, were spreading terror to the inhabitants, particularly the women and children of this section. Learning the direction they took he sleuthed them in his trusty automobile and brought them to bay in the vicinity of the Blue Lake Cemetery." Part of the headline stated: "In another half an hour they would have had the Korbelt mill crew at their mercy." Charley was awarded the Carnegie Medal for Bravery for his participation in the capture; the medal reading "For capture of Japs—Blue Lake, Cal." (The Japanese were eventually all captured and transported to San Francisco, where they were deported.) Charley worked at the mill in Korbelt through World War II, until ill health forced his retirement. He died in 1949 at the age of 79. Lottie lived another eleven years. Charley and Lottie are buried with Lottie's parents, Charles and Nellie Merryman, and Ed and Grace are buried not too far away.--J. Bertolini

18-C	Map	Born in Kansas City, Missouri in 1891, Loren W. DeMotte first studied for the ministry. However, he left those studies and learned the newspaper trade at his father's weekly newspaper in Weatherford, Oklahoma. At the start of World War I, Loren enlisted and became a pilot, rising to the rank of Commanding Officer of the 73rd Aero Squadron; flying over the battlegrounds of Europe. At the end of the war he returned to his newspaper career. In 1926, Loren came to Blue Lake to assist in the installation of a new linotype machine for publisher, Gus Perigot, of the Blue Lake Advocate. The Blue Lake area appealed to Loren, so he stayed and joined the staff of the Advocate and continued on there when Berthe Perigot succeeded her brother, Gus, after his death. Upon Miss Perigot's retirement in 1949, Loren became publisher and editor of the newspaper. Loren was interested in local, as well as state and national affairs and was a member of the American Legion; the advisory board to Humboldt State College and various other Humboldt County boards. He had also been a Fire Chief for the Blue Lake Volunteer Fire Department. He was a strong supporter of many youth programs. Upon his death in 1957, he was given full military rites at his graveside. His first wife, Pearl, is buried beside him.--J. Bertolini

37-H	ADR	Another French settler, to Humboldt County was, Francois Douarin, who first came to this country in 1856 at the age of nineteen. Francois was born near St. Brieuc, Department des Cotes du Nord on March 19, 1837. After his arrival in Trinidad, he travelled to the gold mines along the Trinity River, later returning to the coast and operating a hotel in Arcata. During the Indian conflicts he joined Company B Volunteers. In 1872 he returned to France, where he remained for about three years and there married nineteen-year old Helene Marie Allaiguillaume of Cotes-du-Mord. Shortly after their marriage, the couple returned to California, residing in Arcata until 1885. That year they purchased property in Blue Lake on G Street, first building a home at Railroad and G streets. Francois then moved a former saloon building that had been in Scottsville to First and G streets which he converted into a home for his family. He also dug a well and built a windmill, which he managed to keep functioning, even when other wells were dry, by purchasing a gasoline engine to pump the well. He later connected a second well which he had dug, to the windmill. This water supply would eventually save the Douarin home and prevent the spread of the 1911 fire that destroyed several businesses and the Odd Fellow's and Redman's halls. In 1905, at the age of sixty eight, Francois died of lockjaw after stepping on a rusty nail the previous week. His hard work, saving his money and investing in property provided his family with a comfortable income after his death. His wife, Helene, lived another thirty years after Francois's death. They had six children; five daughters and a son: Ellen Laverty, Louise Baldwin, Victorine Williams, Marie Smith, Ida Harvey and Frank Joseph. Frank Joseph married Sula Pitzer. He died three years after his father, also of lockjaw. The family was very musically gifted and they provided entertainment at many functions. The youngest daughter, Ida, played piano for the silent films, served as pianist for the Rebekah Lodge and also taught in the Blue Lake School. A photograph of the Douarin family in a boat on the lake is prominently hung in the Blue Lake Museum and serves as its logo. Buried with Francois and Helene in the family plot are their daughter, Victorine Williams and son, Frank; daughter, Marie, and her husband, Thaddeus Smith, is also buried in Blue Lake Cemetery.--J.Bertolini

24-G	PG	Robert Burns Hemphill was born in 1862 in Carleton County, New Brunswick, Canada, to Irish immigrants. He came to the United States in 1884, arriving in Humboldt County some time afterwards, where he was naturalized in July of 1892. As with many able-bodied young men who came to the county Burns (as he was known) first worked as a chopper in the woods. After purchasing land in Blue Lake in 1889 he immediately started clearing the land of the native redwood trees and commenced building a home on H Street to which he brought his bride, Alma Waggoner, whom he had married in October of 1889. Burns was such a good woodsman that he was hired by residents on nearby First Avenue to clear it too. Alma was born in 1871 in the Sacramento Valley to Andrew Jackson "Jason" and Mary Jane Waggoner. The Waggoner's had lived for a few years in Tehama County before moving to Humboldt County when Alma was a teenager. The Waggoner's first lived on Stone Lagoon and then settled on land in the mountains near Maple Creek. The Hemphill's had four sons, Harvey, Floyd, Clyde and Alvin, in the following five years. In 1896 the family moved to Rock Ranch in the Maple Creek area, where her brother, Harry Waggoner, was manager. Burns managed the nearby Lords and Sherburn Ranch on Boulder Creek. In 1901 the Hemphill's returned to their home in Blue Lake and the following year Burns was hired as a night watchman for the town. In 1911, Alma established the Blue Lake Candy Store and Bakery and the Sunset Telephone Office. Two years later, they leased another storefront and opened a dry good and notions store, while continuing to operate the candy store and bakery. The older sons, Harvey and Floyd, who were by then both married, worked at the store as clerks. Floyd also worked for a time as an agent for the Well Fargo office and Harvey worked for the Arcata and Mad River Railroad at Korb in the roundhouse. In 1914, the Hemphill's rented a small ranch near Blue Lake, where Burns and his youngest son, Clyde, began raising livestock and farming. When the United States entered into World War I, Hemphill's sons, Alvin and Clyde, were drafted and sent to France. In August of 1918, their parents received notification of Clyde's death due to the epidemic of Spanish Influenza which had spread throughout Europe as well as the United States. His body was shipped back for burial. In 1921 Alma sold her candy store and bakery along with the Sunset Telephone Central Office to Mr. and Mrs. W.E. Kennedy and she and Burns retired to their home at Belmont, near Maple Creek. On September 19, 1925, Mr. Hemphill was returning to his home after delivering livestock to Korb. A father and son were accompanying him home, when one of them shot a deer. While tracking the deer, the son stumbled and accidentally discharged his gun, killing Mr. Hemphill. In 1928, Mrs. Hemphill purchased a wooded area known as "Alexis Park" from Mrs. Mathilde Loupiac of San Francisco. She then built cottages at the edge of the park to rent out. Years later the land was sold and cleared and new homes were built for returning servicemen after the end of World War II. Before her death in 1943, Alma had stipulated that no trees could be cut until the land was paid for.

26-G	Map	John E. Lindstrand was born in Reftled, Sweden in 1872. He emigrated to Korbelt, California in 1891 at the age of 19, where he worked in the lumber mill as a millwright. In January of 1898 he married Clara Anderson, who had also immigrated to California from the same village, at the Blue Lake Presbyterian Church. They made their home in the company housing in Korbelt, where later that year, their daughter, Luella "Marie" was born. In January of 1900, a son, Leonard Carl was born; 1901 daughter, Alfa Carolina, and in 1907, Joan Claire. Alfa died in 1909 of heart disease after contracting diphtheria. The children attended school in Korbelt and later, Arcata High School. In 1915, Leonard left school at the age of 15 to work as a surveyor for the Northern Redwood Lumber Company. In 1919, John and Leonard purchased the Blue Lake Garage, at auction, from Oliver Mulvaney. The family moved to Blue Lake soon after the purchase. The business became known as Lindstrand's Garage, which they enlarged and remodeled and in the early 1920's they contracted with the California Automobile Association to service motorist's needs and were ranked nineteenth in the state. Leonard met Ethel Cox, a native of Fresno, who had come to Arcata to attend Humboldt State College. They were married in 1927, after her graduation, at the Blue Lake Presbyterian Church. A daughter, Barbara Jean, was born in 1928 in Arcata, and a son, John "Jack" Carl, was born in 1929 in Blue Lake. In 1932, The Lindstrand's purchased Lewis's General Merchandise Store from Ed Lewis; also at an auction. The building had been built in 1876 in Scottsville by William M. Scott and had been moved in 1898 to its location at Railroad and G streets across from the Lindstrand's Garage. The upstairs of the store had been used as a meeting room for the Forester's Lodge and the Volunteer Fire Department. Leonard continued to work with his father at the garage. They hired Clarence Oslin, who had married Ethel's sister, Mary, to manage the store. John also had property in Sweden which he had purchased during his many trips to his homeland. In 1938, Leonard and Ethel purchased the two-story former residence of Reverend William Baesler, which his wife, Louise, had donated to the Blue Lake Presbyterian Church. They remodeled the home which had been built in 1904; maintaining the house and gardens, and the home has remained one of the best kept homes in Blue Lake. In the early 1940's John began to ease into retirement with Leonard assuming the management of the garage. While fishing with his son and grandson in 1942, John suffered a massive heart attack and died at the age of 70. In 1947, Leonard sold the garage to Lester and Harold Sundquist, expecting to retire, relax and devote time to civic duties and his family. Leonard was active in the Masonic Lodge, the Knights of Pythias and the Mad River Grange. He was also involved in both the Korbelt and Blue Lake volunteer fire department and a member of the Presbyterian Church. He had served on the board of the Arcata branch of Bank of America, the Blue Lake City Council; the Arcata High School Board of Trustees and was active in the construction of Perigot Park. His retirement was short lived, however. Clarence Oslin, manager of the family store, became ill and died in 1949. Leonard took over the management and was joined by his son, Jack, in 1951. Jack had married Berlene Beshears in 1950; in that same year their son, John Lynn, was born, but the infant died six days later.

Indian Cem.	BLR	In 1977, Leonard and Jack sold the store, but it did not remain open long after that; as the days of small time grocery stores succumbed to larger supermarkets. Buried in the Lindstrand family plot are John and Clara, who died in 1956 at the age of 82; their daughters, Luella "Marie," who had become a nurse and died in San Francisco in 1925 at the age of 27, and Alfa Caroline who was eight at the time of her death; their son Leonard, who had died in 1987 at the age of 87 and his wife Ethel, who had died in 1989, at the age of 82. Also buried in the plot are Leonard and Ethel's daughter-in-law, Berlene (Beshears) Lindstrand and her infant son, John Lynn. Clara's brothers, Ben and Carl Justus Anderson are also interred in the family plot. John's brother, Charles William, and his wife, Hannah are buried in another plot in the Blue Lake Cemetery.—<i>J. Bertolini</i> Unlike many immigrants to the state, Lancaster Lupton did not make a headlong rush across the wide expanse of North America to California. His journey took many years and created a lasting legacy. Lancaster Platt Lupton was born in New York State, probably in Delaware County, on September 21, 1807, to William and Julia Townsend Lupton. One of William's ancestors, Lancaster Symes, had at one time been awarded, (but never gained ownership of) nearly half of Staten Island for their service to Queen Anne. Lancaster's father, though a prominent lawyer, through a series of poor investments and ill fortune, did not have the same success as his ancestor, and had difficulty supporting his family. However, he succeeded in obtaining an appointment for his son to West Point. Lancaster was graduated in July of 1829 and assigned to Jefferson Barracks in St. Louis for further training, finally landing in Fort Towson and assigned to the rebuilding of the Post. During that time he was noted as a capable officer. In 1833 the United States Dragoons, an elite mounted infantry, was created and Lt. Lupton was assigned to recruit members. While posted at Fort Leavenworth, in 1835, the officers of the fort, suffering from discontent and boredom, began bickering and Lt. Lupton, ill suited for the political intrigue of his fellow West Point graduates, related the remarks of one officer about another, bringing about a challenge of a duel. The challenger, Captain Duncan, was court-martialed and Lancaster was also to be court-martialed for conduct unbecoming an officer and the added charge of making disparaging remarks about the then-president, Andrew Jackson. Lancaster, who had been unsuccessfully requesting a leave for years to take care of business on the East Coast, resigned his commission in frustration before this eminent court martial, hoping to beat his letter of resignation and plead his case while there. However, his letter arrived before he did and his resignation was accepted.

	Obits	Suddenly without a career, and perhaps out of a need to distance himself from his source of embarrassment, Lancaster headed west to the fur trapping regions of what was then called Indian Territory, now called Colorado, where he once, as a Dragoon, had escorted supply trains and learned about life on the trail. He had also been a quartermaster in the Army and understood the task of establishing a fort and negotiating with the Indians. With this in mind he chose a location on the South Platte River and in 1837 began building an outpost, originally called Fort Lancaster, but finally called Fort Lupton. With the help of his Missouri based backers, Rich and Wilson, he purchased the needed items for trading; hardware, trinkets, supplies and yes—whiskey, for buffalo robes. He took a wife, Thomass (one of several spelling variations for her name,) from the Cheyenne tribe and they had two sons, John, and Platt. For several years he was successful in his endeavors even establishing another fort on the North Platte River in 1841, called Fort Platte. However, fierce competition, the decline in buffalo, and many other factors caused Lancaster to close Fort Platte and finally Fort Lupton in 1844. During this time he visited his parents in Wisconsin and revealed his marriage and children. He also sought to be reestablished in the army, but met with no success. He joined a caravan of fur traders and traveled back to the West to Bent's Fort where his family had remained with Thomass's tribe, and from there he petitioned for a position as an Indian Agent, but no appointment was made. Sons, George (name for George Bent) and Lancaster, were born about that time; Lancaster, Jr. dying about 1846. He and his family relocated to Hardscrabble near Pueblo, Colorado in 1847 and he began farming. In 1848-49 the family relocated again to California, where Lancaster probably hoped to cash in on the gold rush. In the 1850 census, he and his family along with 2 month old daughter, Elizabeth, were located in Calaveras County, where Lancaster is listed as a miner. He stayed in the San Joaquin area where daughters, Julia, a second Elizabeth (the first having died about 1854) and son, William, were born. Finally, he arrived in Arcata, Humboldt County, about 1870. There, he lived in relative anonymity, purchasing land in the area known as Green Point. Thomass was known for her beautiful gardens and her generosity with her produce and his sons as "crack-shots." Lancaster died October 1, 1885 and Thomass on the 18th of February, 1892. The couple was originally buried in the "Scottsville Cemetery," but with the eminent construction of a freeway nearby, they were relocated to the Blue Lake Cemetery, where their son, George, who died December 26, 1905 and their daughters Julia Dow Skinner, who died August 1, 1937 and Elizabeth Larsen, who died January 4th, 1928 are also buried. Lancaster may have died in anonymity in Humboldt County, but Fort Lupton in Colorado lived on, the original structure falling into disrepair and destruction; but a town of its namesake grew up nearby leaving a lasting legacy for its founder, Lancaster Platt Lupton. Monuments have been placed in recognition of Lupton's contributions to the fur-trading industry near the reconstructed Fort Laramie in Wyoming, near Chadron, Nebraska and near the original Fort Lupton, which is in the process of being reconstructed.--K. 26-G	ADR	John Alexander "Jack" MacPherson was born on Prince Edward Island, Canada in 1861. He came to Humboldt County about 1888, where he homesteaded in the mountains near Maple Creek. In 1896 he married Mary Emma Waggoner, the daughter of his neighbors, Jason and Mary Jane Waggoner. By 1900 three children, Maude, Mary and John Jr. were born. That same year they purchased four lots in Blue Lake from Alexis Chartin and Alexander Brizard. On one lot Jack built and operated a livery stable. At the lot on First and H Streets stood the former Blue Lake Advocate building which he relocated to the First and G Street lot and converted into a home for his family. Jack was an active member of the Presbyterian Church and a member of Redman and Woodmen of the World lodges and involved in various civic affairs. When Blue Lake was incorporated in 1910, he was on the first Committee for six years and served as president for two terms. In 1911 a fire destroyed his livery stable, as well as several other businesses. He relocated his business and continued until the livery business declined. Jack was then employed by the city in various capacities. He demolished the former school building and used the lumber to build a large barn on his First street property; there he kept horses and a wagon to gravel and grade the streets. He maintained the water system, and collected city taxes and water fees. He also served as a constable and city marshal for seventeen years. After a lingering illness, Emma died in 1926 at the age of 47. Jack died in 1950 at the age of 89. Both are buried in the MacPherson family plot with their daughter Mary MacPherson.--J. Bertolini

10-A	ADR	Joseph E. "Joe" Merriam was born in Port Greville, Nova Scotia, Canada, in 1856. At the age of fourteen, he served as a mate on a sailing ship, eventually rising to the rank of Captain. During this time he married Clara Webster, and after the birth of their daughter, Adeline, in 1883, he left the life at sea. The following year, he and his family sailed to New York and booked passage to California, finally settling in Humboldt County. In the spring of 1898, the family moved to the mountains near Maple Creek, where Joseph maintained a ranch for nine years. Three children, Harold "Harry", Henrietta and Elsie were born after their arrival in the county. Joe and Clara sold their mountain homestead in 1890 and settled in Blue Lake. The next year, he became Justice of the Peace; serving in that capacity for fifteen years, before devoting his time to the insurance and real estate business. Joseph took an active part in Humboldt County affairs as well as those of the Blue Lake community. He served on the committee to set the city boundaries and to investigate incorporating in 1909. The following year Blue Lake became incorporated. In 1911, he was the instigator of the "Blue Nose Picnic," that brought together natives of the Canadian Maritime provinces and the New England coast states. This event grew into a two-day affair and was enthusiastically embraced by the entire county. Joe's fraternal interests were the Woodmen of the World and the Redman lodges. Buried with Joseph in the family plot, are an infant daughter, daughters, Henrietta, who died at the age of fourteen; Adeline, and her husband, Jean B. Tamboury; and Elsie Moore. Their son, Harry, and his wife, Minnie are buried with her parents, David and Ella Griffiths. --J. Bertolini
