January 1, 1890

A PIONEER WOMAN

On Monday, Mrs. Caroline KAMP died at her residence, corner of Eleventh and Margaret Streets in this City, at the age of 74 years, her husband, B. KAMP, having died a few weeks ago.

Mrs. KAMP, her husband, and eight children came across the plains to California in 1849. She was a courageous and generous-hearted woman and leaves eight children and many friends to mourn her loss.

The funeral took place this afternoon.

JUDGE SENTER

The Death of a Former San Josean at Tacoma

Chas. N. Senter, Police Judge of Tacoma, Washington, died at his residence there yesterday. The body will be embalmed and shipped to this city for burial, by direction of his daughter, Mrs. B. F. RICKERT.

Judge SENTER was brought up in this county and when he entered the legal profession soon became one of the leading attorneys. He went to Tacoma several years ago, and in a short time acquired a lucrative practice, and was honored by the people in being elected to the responsible position he held at the time of his death.

FIRST STREET FIRE

A Blaze in a Saloon Endangers the Phelan Block

Last evening a fire was discovered in the basement of the Louvre Saloon on North First Street. The fire was first discovered by W. D. J. HAMBLY, who occupies a room in one of the upper stories. An alarm was sounded and the department was soon out. The fire was in the basement which had been used as a store room for liquors.

The damage consists primarily of the destruction of a barrel of whiskey and some cases of champagne. The floor is burned in places, but otherwise the building is not damaged.

The owner, Mr. GEOFFREY, is of the opinion that \$1,500 from the insurance companies will place him all right financially. There was an ample insurance. It was a close call for the entire building.

"BARTHOLOMEW -- In this City, November 19, 1919, at Hahnehann Hospital, John William Bartholomew, a native of Australia.

"Interment was private Thursday, November 20, 1919, from the parlors of Carew & English, 1618 Geary Street."

This is not too helpful, but at least it gives you his date of death. Also, a letter to Carew & English might bring forth the names of his children.

The following is a bit of interesting information about the above family which Laverne has given us to print. Items like these make these families seem more real, don't you agree?

"Samuel Crockett Young and Nancy S. (Leigh) Young had a house built for their daughter, Martha Elmira Angelina, for a wedding present when she married George M. Schuck. The location believed to have been on East side of South Sixth Street between Santa Clara and San Fernando Streets. This information from a deed dated 26 Nov. 1833, sale of Shuck property to Laura G. Stout (prior to Schucks' removal to Oregon. The house was moved to 700 block, South Ninth Street before 1906 earthquake. Demolished 1965.

"Professor George M. Schuck was an instructor of music in the University (College) of the Pacific in San Jose. In Oregon he was a teacher of music at the Bishop Scott School (now St. Helen's Hall), organist at the Grace Methodist Church, and a member of the Odd Fellows, serving as officer for the lodge.

"The Schucks' son, Frank Y. was listed as a merchant in the information obtained from Finley's Chapel, Portland, Oregon.

"Kate Leigh Schuck graduated from San Jose Normal, taught school in Portland, Oregon. She married John William Bartholomew in San Jose.

"Fred Howard Schuck is buried in Schuck plot adjoining that of his grandparents, Samuel Crockett Young and Nancy (Leigh) Young -- Pioneer Section, Oak Hill Cemetery, San Jose."

"HENDRIX -- In Oakland, July 16, 1928, Laura A., wife of the late Niles A. Hendrix, and mother of Mrs. Angie H. WEBSTER and H. W. HENDRIX; a native of New York, aged 77 years.

Friends are invited to the funeral Wednesday, July 18, at 11 a.m. at the family residence, 1520 Wellington Street. Graveside services will be held at Oak Hill Cemetery, San Jose, at 2:15 p.m."

Too bad that this does not mention Laura's parents or her brothers and sisters. I have two suggestions:

1. Write to Alameda County Health Dept., 499 - 5th Street, Oakland, Calif. (sending \$2.00 ) for Laura's death certificate. It will probably give her parent's names if you don't already have these.
2. Also write the same office asking them to search for the record of death of Mary McKEE, wife of San Jose Mayor, George B. McKEE. According to his obituary (QUICKSILVER DIGGIN'S - Volume I May 1973), she died in 1884. Since we do not find any record in Santa Clara County of her death, it is quite possible that she died in neighboring Alameda County. Mary's death certificate should also give her parents' names, and if the same as Laura's we would then have proven they were sisters. There is information here in San Jose libraries on Mary's family which would then be valuable to you.
