"From reading about Frank H. BARTHOLOMEW in Who's Who in America, learned that he has lead and is leading a most interesting life. He began as a newspaper man in 1918, reporter for the Morning Oregonian and Evening Telegram, Portland, Oregon; sport editor Vancouver, B.C. Sun; business manager, United Press, Portland 1921-1922; Los Angeles 1922-1923, business representative Kansas City 1923-1924; Pacific division manager San Francisco 1924-193; vice president in charge of Pacific Area, including Alaska, Hawaii, Australia, Mexico, Central American republics and Panama; since 1930 in charge of all correspondence covering Pacific War since Jan. 1, 1943, accredited war correspondent covering Papaun campaign in New Guinea Jan. Feb. 1943, and Aleutian campaign July - Sept. 1943, Okinawa, (10th Army) and Luzon (38th Div.) May-June 1945, covered Japanese surrender aboard the U.S.S. Missouri, Tokyo Bay Sept. 1945, atomic bomb tests, Bikini, July-Aug 1946. Commended by General MacArthur in general orders, U.S.A.F.P., Tokyo; official naval commendation by Secretary Forestal, and Admiral H. B. Miller, Washington, Vice President United Press Association, 1st Light Infantry U.S. Army 1918, Member of American Council Institute of Pacific Relations, Sigma Delta Chi - Mason -(Shriner). The location believed to have been on East side of South Sixth Street between Santa Clara and San Fernando Streets. This information from a deed dated 26 Nov. 1833, sale of Shuck property to Laura G. Stout (prior to Schucks' removal to Oregon. The house was moved to 700 block, South Ninth Street before 1906 earthquake. Demolished 1965.

"Professor George M. Schuck was an instructor of music in the University (College) of the Pacific in San Jose. In Oregon he was a teacher of music at the Bishop Scott School (now St. Helen's Hall), organist at the Grace Methodist Church, and a member of the Odd Fellows, serving as officer for the lodge.

"The Schucks' son, Frank Y. was listed as a merchant in the information obtained from Finley's Chapel, Portland, Oregon.

"Kate Leigh Schuck graduated from San Jose Normal, taught school in Portland, Oregon. She married John William Bartholomew in San Jose.

"Fred Howard Schuck is buried in Schuck plot adjoining that of his grandparents, Samuel Crockett Young and Nancy (Leigh) Young -- Pioneer Section, Oak Hill Cemetery, San Jose."

If the letter is returned as undeliverable, the next step would be to check to see if this "informant" had died -- if so, an obituary on him or her might provide us with another descendant.

Anyway, we hope by the time we get the January '74 issue ready, we'll have some descendants for Mr. LAIRD.

"HENDRIX -- In Oakland, July 16, 1928, Laura A., wife of the late Niles A. Hendrix, and mother of Mrs. Angie H. WEBSTER and H. W. HENDRIX; a native of New York, aged 77 years.

Friends are invited to the funeral Wednesday, July 18, at 11 a.m. at the family residence, 1520 Wellington Street. Graveside services will be held at Oak Hill Cemetery, San Jose, at 2:15 p.m."

Too bad that this does not mention Laura's parents or her brothers and sisters. I have two suggestions:

- 1. Write to Alameda County Health Dept., 499 5th Street, Oakland, Calif. (sending \$2.00) for Laura's death certificate. It will probably give her parent's names if you don't already have these.
- 2. Also write the same office asking them to search for the record of death of Mary McKEE, wife of San Jose Mayor, George B. McKEE. According to his obituary (QUICKSILVER DIGGIN'S Volume I May 1973), she died in 1884. Since we do not find any record in Santa Clara County of her death, it is quite possible that she died in neighboring Alameda County. Mary's death certificate should also give her parents' names, and if the same as Laura's we would then have proven they were sisters. There is information here in San Jose libraries on Mary's family which would then be valuable to you.
